Bill Summary

Under current law, each school district, board of cooperative services, and charter school and the state charter school institute (local education provider) is required to post on its web site the local education provider's actual expenditures, including actual salary expenditures and actual benefit expenditures, at the local education provider level and at the school-site level. The bill requires the local education providers to

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-44-105, amend 3 as it exists until proclamation of the governor (4) (b) (II), (4) (b) (III), 4 and (4) (e) (I); repeal (4) (c); and add (4) (b) (IV) and (4) (d.5) as 5 follows: **Budget - contents - mandatory.** (4) (b) 6 22-44-105. In 7 implementing and maintaining the financial and human resource reporting 8 system pursuant to paragraph (a) of this section, the state board of 9 education shall adhere to, but is not limited to, the following guidelines: 10 (II) The reporting system must provide standard definitions for 11 employment positions such that full, accurate disclosure of administrative 12 costs is made within the budgets and the financial statements of every 13 school district: and 14 (III) The reporting system must make it possible to collect 15 comparable data by program and school site; AND 16 (IV) THE REPORTING SYSTEM MUST REQUIRE AND THE STANDARD 17 CHART OF ACCOUNTS MUST INCLUDE THE REPORTING OF ACTUAL 18 EXPENDITURES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ACTUAL SALARY 19 EXPENDITURES AND ACTUAL BENEFIT EXPENDITURES REPORTED BY JOB 20 CATEGORY SPECIFIED IN THE STANDARD CHART OF ACCOUNTS, AT THE 21 SCHOOL-SITE LEVEL, SCHOOL DISTRICT LEVEL, STATE CHARTER SCHOOL 22 INSTITUTE LEVEL, AND BOARD OF COOPERATIVE SERVICES LEVEL. 23 (c) Nothing in this section shall be interpreted to require 24 accounting of salary and benefit costs by school site.

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1 (d.5)THE DEPARTMENT SHALL COLLECT, REVIEW, AND 2 STANDARDIZE THE FINANCIAL DATA REPORTED BY CHARTER SCHOOLS, 3 SCHOOL DISTRICTS, THE STATE CHARTER SCHOOL INSTITUTE, AND BOARDS 4 OF COOPERATIVE SERVICES PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (4) TO ENSURE 5 THE GREATEST LEVEL OF TRANSPARENCY AND COMPARABILITY OF 6 EXPENDITURES AMONG SCHOOL SITES, SCHOOL DISTRICTS, THE STATE 7 CHARTER SCHOOL INSTITUTE, AND BOARDS OF COOPERATIVE SERVICES. 8 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ENSURE THAT THE DATA IS POSTED ON THE WEB 9 SITE CREATED PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH (e) OF THIS SUBSECTION (4).

10 (e) (I) The department shall issue a request for proposals and 11 contract for the creation of a web site view that, at a minimum, translates 12 the expenditures for each of the major categories specified in the chart of 13 accounts for school sites, school districts, the state charter school 14 institute, and boards of cooperative services, as posted on the web site 15 maintained REPORTED by each local education provider pursuant to 16 section 22-44-304 THROUGH THE REPORTING SYSTEM AND STANDARDIZED 17 BY THE DEPARTMENT, into a format that is readable by a layperson. The 18 department and the entity with which the department contracts, if any, 19 shall work with the financial policies and procedures advisory committee 20 and a representative from the office of state planning and budgeting in 21 designing the presentation of data on the web site view to ensure the 22 greatest degree of clarity and comparability by laypersons of expenditures 23 among school sites, school districts, the state charter school institute, and 24 boards of cooperative services.

25 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-44-304, amend 26 (3) (a); and repeal (1) (d) as follows:

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22-44-304. Financial reporting - on-line access to information

repeal. (1) (d) Additionally, commencing July 1, 2015, each local
 education provider shall post in a format that can be downloaded and
 sorted, for free public access, the local education provider's actual
 expenditures, including but not limited to actual salary expenditures and
 actual benefit expenditures reported by job category specified in the
 standard chart of accounts, at the local education provider level and at the
 school-site level.

8 (3) (a) Each local education provider shall update the information 9 specified in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of subsection (1) of this section 10 within sixty days after the local education provider's completion or receipt 11 of the applicable report, statement, or document. Each local education 12 provider shall update the information specified in paragraph (d) of 13 subsection (1) of this section annually by a date specified by the financial 14 policies and procedures advisory committee.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
