Joint Budget Committee. The bill requires the state treasurer to transfer \$2,175,000 from the general fund to the department of state cash fund. This transfer repays moneys transferred from the cash fund to the general fund during the fiscal year 2008-09.





1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-21-104, amend
3 (3) (d) (XII.5) as follows:

24-21-104. 4 Fees of secretary of state - repeal. 5 (3) (d) (XII.5) (A) Notwithstanding any provision of paragraph (b) of this 6 subsection (3) to the contrary, on April 20, 2009, the state treasurer shall 7 deduct two million one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars from the 8 department of state cash fund and transfer such sum to the general fund. 9 ON JUNE 30, 2014, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL DEDUCT TWO MILLION 10 ONE HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL 11 FUND AND TRANSFER SUCH SUM TO THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE CASH 12 FUND. 13 (B) THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (XII.5) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1,

14 2014.

SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
