A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING A LIMITATION ON WHEN A DISCIPLINARY ACTION MAY BE
102 COMMENCED AGAINST A MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL.

Bill Summary

The bill requires any disciplinary proceeding against a mental health professional to be commenced within 3 years after the alleged act or failure to act giving rise to the proceeding.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-43-224, amend
3	(1) (a) as follows:
4	12-43-224. Disciplinary proceedings - judicial review - mental
5	and physical examinations - multiple licenses. (1) (a) A proceeding for
6	discipline of a licensee, registrant, or certificate holder may be
7	commenced when the board that licenses, registers, or certifies the
8	licensee, registrant, or certificate holder has reasonable grounds to believe
9	that the licensee, registrant, or certificate holder under the board's
10	jurisdiction has committed any act or failed to act pursuant to the grounds
11	established in section 12-43-222 or 12-43-226. A PROCEEDING FOR
12	DISCIPLINE MUST BE COMMENCED WITHIN THREE YEARS AFTER THE
13	ALLEGED ACT OR FAILURE TO ACT GIVING RISE TO THE PROCEEDING.
14	SECTION 2. Effective date - applicability. This act takes effect
15	July 1, 2014, and applies to proceedings commenced on or after said date.
16	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
17	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
18	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
