A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING A PROGRAM TO COVER VULNERABLE POPULATIONS'
102	COSTS OF ACQUIRING NECESSARY DOCUMENTS, AND, IN
103	CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill defines a "necessary document" as a social security card; one of the following documents or analogous documents issued by another jurisdiction: A driver's license, an identification card, or a vital statistics certificate or vital statistics report (such as a birth, death, or marriage certificate); or a document required as a condition of issuance of one of these documents. The bill directs the office of health equity in the department of public health and environment to administer a necessary document program. The office will make grants to or contract with a nonprofit entity or collection of nonprofit entities that conduct a collaborative identification project to assist Colorado residents who are victims of domestic violence, impacted by a natural disaster, low-income, disabled, homeless, or elderly and who are seeking documentation of their identity, status, or citizenship by paying the fees to acquire a necessary document. \$300,000 is annually appropriated to the office from the general fund to administer the program.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 25-4-2208 as 3 follows: 4 25-4-2208. Necessary document program - definition - repeal. 5 (1) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, "NECESSARY DOCUMENT" MEANS: 6 (a) A SOCIAL SECURITY CARD ISSUED PURSUANT TO 42 U.S.C. SEC. 7 405 (c) (2) (G);8 (b) ONE OF THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS ISSUED IN COLORADO OR 9 ANALOGOUS DOCUMENTS ISSUED IN ANOTHER JURISDICTION: 10 (I) A DRIVER'S LICENSE ISSUED PURSUANT TO PART 1 OF ARTICLE 11 2 OF TITLE 42, C.R.S.; 12 (II) AN IDENTIFICATION CARD ISSUED PURSUANT TO PART 3 OF 13 ARTICLE 2 OF TITLE 42, C.R.S.; AND 14 (III) A VITAL STATISTICS CERTIFICATE OR VITAL STATISTICS 15 REPORT ISSUED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 2 OF THIS TITLE; OR 16 (c) ANY DOCUMENT REQUIRED AS A CONDITION OF ISSUANCE OF A 17 DOCUMENT SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH (a) OR (b) OF THIS SUBSECTION (1). 18 (2) THE OFFICE SHALL ADMINISTER A NECESSARY DOCUMENT 19 PROGRAM. THE OFFICE SHALL MAKE ONE OR MORE GRANTS PER FISCAL 20 YEAR TO, ENTER INTO ONE OR MORE VENDOR CONTRACTS WITH, OR BOTH, A NONPROFIT ENTITY OR COLLECTION OF NONPROFIT ENTITIES THAT
 CONDUCT A COLLABORATIVE IDENTIFICATION PROJECT TO ASSIST
 COLORADO RESIDENTS WHO ARE VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE,
 IMPACTED BY A NATURAL DISASTER, LOW-INCOME, DISABLED, HOMELESS,
 OR ELDERLY AND WHO ARE SEEKING DOCUMENTATION OF THEIR IDENTITY,
 STATUS, OR CITIZENSHIP BY PAYING THE FEES TO ACQUIRE A NECESSARY
 DOCUMENT.

8 (3) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY SHALL ANNUALLY APPROPRIATE TO
9 THE OFFICE UP TO THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE
10 GENERAL FUND. THE OFFICE SHALL EXPEND THE MONEY FOR THE
11 PURPOSES SPECIFIED IN THIS SECTION, INCLUDING UP TO FIFTEEN
12 THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR THE OFFICE'S DIRECT AND INDIRECT COSTS IN
13 ADMINISTERING THE NECESSARY DOCUMENT PROGRAM.

(4) THIS SECTION IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 2021.
SECTION 2. Appropriation. For the 2016-17 state fiscal year,
\$300,000 is appropriated to the department of public health and
environment for use by the administration and support division. This
appropriation is from the general fund. To implement this act, the division
may use this appropriation for the necessary document program.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
