

### **Bill Summary**

**Joint Budget Committee.** The bill repeals the Colorado advisory council for persons with disabilities and the disabled parking education program, makes conforming amendments, and reduces an appropriation.

1 (7). The general assembly shall appropriate the moneys MONEY in the 2 fund for the purposes specified in sections 42-1-227, 42-3-204 and 3 42-4-1208. Unexpended and unencumbered moneys MONEY in the fund 4 at the end of a fiscal year shall remain REMAINS in the fund and shall not 5 be credited or transferred to the general fund or another fund. The 6 department may accept gifts, grants, or donations from private or public 7 sources for the purposes of this section. All private and public funds 8 received through gifts, grants, or donations shall MUST be transmitted to 9 the state treasurer, who shall credit the moneys MONEY to the fund.

When a person files an application 20 for issuance or renewal of an identifying plate or placard under this 21 section, the department shall provide to the applicant an informational 22 pamphlet or other informational source, developed by the department, that 23 describes reserved parking and the rights and responsibilities of the 24 holders of identifying plates or placards. 1 SECTION 7. Appropriation - adjustments to 2020 long bill. To 2 implement this act, the general fund appropriation made in the annual 3 general appropriation act for the 2020-21 state fiscal year to the 4 department of human services for use by the special purpose division for 5 the Colorado advisory council for persons with disabilities is decreased 6 by \$238,497 and the related FTE is decreased by 1.0 FTE.

SECTION 8. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
