# A BILL FOR AN ACT

#### 101 CONCERNING THE CREATION OF A SCHOOL SAFETY GRANT PROGRAM,

AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

#### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill creates the enhance school safety incident response grant program in the division of homeland security and emergency management in the department of public safety (grant program) to provide funding for research, program development, and training to improve school safety incident response. development, and upgrade technology and infrastructure used for training related to school safety incident response.

Applications for the grants must be made by October 1 and grants must be awarded by December 1 for each year of the grant program. Applicants must be nonprofit, tax-exempt organizations and must have experience providing school safety incident response training and working with law enforcement, first responders, school districts, and school personnel on issues related to school safety incident response.

The bill makes an appropriation from the marijuana tax cash fund and makes a conforming amendment to the statute creating that fund. The grant program and conforming amendment are repealed effective June 30, 2021.

14 ITS CAMPUS.

15 (7) "School safety incident response" means the actions
16 TAKEN DIRECTLY FOLLOWING THE ONSET OF A SCHOOL SAFETY INCIDENT
17 TO PROVIDE IMMEDIATE ASSISTANCE TO PROTECT LIVES; CONTAIN THE
18 INCIDENT; ENSURE THE SECURITY OF THE SCHOOL, ITS STUDENTS AND
19 PERSONNEL, AND THE SURROUNDING COMMUNITY; AND RESTORE
20 ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS.

21 24-33.5-2103. Enhance school safety incident response grant
22 program - creation - guidelines. (1) THERE IS HEREBY CREATED IN THE
23 DIVISION THE ENHANCE SCHOOL SAFETY INCIDENT RESPONSE GRANT
24 PROGRAM TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR RESEARCH, PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT,
25 AND TRAINING TO IMPROVE SCHOOL SAFETY INCIDENT RESPONSE.

26 (2) GRANT RECIPIENTS MAY USE THE MONEY RECEIVED THROUGH
27 THE GRANT PROGRAM FOR THE FOLLOWING PURPOSES:

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(a) DEVELOPING AND PROVIDING TRAINING PROGRAMS,
 CURRICULUMS, AND SEMINARS RELATED TO SCHOOL SAFETY INCIDENT
 RESPONSE;

4 (b) DEVELOPING BEST PRACTICES AND PROTOCOLS RELATED TO
5 SCHOOL SAFETY INCIDENT RESPONSE;

6 (c) CONDUCTING RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT RELATING TO

8 (d) UPGRADING TECHNOLOGY AND INFRASTRUCTURE USED TO
9 PROVIDE TRAINING AND EDUCATION RELATED TO SCHOOL SAFETY

(3) THE DIVISION SHALL ADMINISTER THE GRANT PROGRAM AND,
 SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE APPROPRIATIONS, SHALL AWARD GRANTS AS
 PROVIDED IN THIS PART 21. SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE APPROPRIATIONS,
 GRANTS SHALL BE PAID OUT OF MONEY APPROPRIATED FOR THE GRANT
 PROGRAM AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 24-33.5-2106.

16 (4) THE DIVISION SHALL IMPLEMENT THE GRANT PROGRAM IN
17 ACCORDANCE WITH THIS PART 21 AND SHALL ESTABLISH GUIDELINES AS
18 NECESSARY TO ACCOMPLISH THE PURPOSES OF THIS PART 21.

20 program - application - criteria - awards. (1) TO RECEIVE A GRANT, AN

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(b) HAS EXPERIENCE PROVIDING TRAINING FOR SCHOOL SAFETY
 INCIDENT RESPONSE;

3 (c) HAS EXPERIENCE WORKING WITH LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES
4 AND OTHER FIRST RESPONDERS; AND

5 (d) HAS EXPERIENCE WORKING WITH SCHOOL DISTRICTS, SCHOOL
6 PERSONNEL, AND STUDENTS ON ISSUES RELATED TO SCHOOL SAFETY
7 INCIDENT RESPONSE.

8 (2) THE DIVISION SHALL REVIEW THE APPLICATIONS RECEIVED
9 PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION. IN AWARDING GRANTS, THE DIVISION SHALL
10 CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:

11 (a) THE APPLICANT'S CAPACITY TO COORDINATE WITH LAW
12 ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AND FIRST RESPONDERS STATEWIDE;

13 (b) THE APPLICANT'S CAPACITY TO SERVE SCHOOL DISTRICTS,
14 SCHOOL PERSONNEL, AND STUDENTS STATEWIDE;

15 (c) THE APPLICANT'S EXPERIENCE IN PROVIDING TRAINING
16 RELATED TO SCHOOL SAFETY INCIDENT RESPONSE;

17 (d) THE APPLICANT'S EXPERIENCE IN ADDRESSING THE
18 PSYCHOLOGICAL AND MENTAL HEALTH TRAUMA AFFECTING VICTIMS AND
19 FIRST RESPONDERS FOLLOWING SCHOOL SAFETY INCIDENTS, THE
20 PSYCHOLOGICAL FOOTPRINT OF A SCHOOL SAFETY INCIDENT, AND TRAUMA
21 RECOVERY; AND

(e) THE APPLICANT'S EXPERIENCE PROVIDING RECOMMENDATIONS
TO LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AND OTHER FIRST RESPONDERS, SCHOOL
DISTRICTS, AND COMMUNITIES TO SUPPORT MENTAL HEALTH RECOVERY
AFTER SCHOOL SAFETY INCIDENTS.

26 (3) SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE APPROPRIATIONS, ON OR BEFORE
27 DECEMBER 1 EACH YEAR OF THE GRANT PROGRAM, THE DIVISION SHALL

AWARD GRANTS AS PROVIDED IN THIS PART 21. THE DIVISION SHALL
 DISTRIBUTE THE GRANT MONEY WITHIN THIRTY DAYS AFTER AWARDING
 THE GRANTS.

4 **Reporting requirements.** ON OR BEFORE 24-33.5-2105. 5 DECEMBER 1, 2019, AND ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 EACH YEAR 6 THEREAFTER, EACH ORGANIZATION THAT RECEIVES A GRANT THROUGH 7 THE GRANT PROGRAM SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE DIVISION. AT A 8 MINIMUM, THE REPORT MUST DOCUMENT THE ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED, 9 SERVICES OR TRAININGS PROVIDED, TOOLS OR PROTOCOLS DEVELOPED, 10 AND SUCH OTHER INFORMATION AS THE DIVISION MAY REQUEST TO 11 MONITOR THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE GRANT.

12 24-33.5-2106. Funding for grant program. The GENERAL
13 ASSEMBLY SHALL APPROPRIATE MONEY TO THE DIVISION TO
14 IMPLEMENT THE GRANT PROGRAM. THE DIVISION MAY USE A PORTION OF
15 THE MONEY APPROPRIATED FOR THE PROGRAM TO PAY THE DIRECT AND
16 INDIRECT COSTS THAT THE DIVISION INCURS TO ADMINISTER THE GRANT
17 PROGRAM.

18 24-33.5-2107. Repeal of part. This PART 21 is REPEALED,
19 EFFECTIVE JUNE 30, 2021.

20 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-1807, add
21 (6) as follows:

23 (6) (a) IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER PURPOSE AUTHORIZED BY THIS
24 SECTION, SUBJECT TO ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BY THE GENERAL
25 ASSEMBLY, THE DIVISION OF HOMELAND SECURITY AND EMERGENCY
26 MANAGEMENT IS AUTHORIZED TO EXPEND MONEY FROM THE FUND FOR

(b) THIS SUBSECTION (6) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JUNE 30, 2021.

3 **SECTION 3. Appropriation.** For the 2018-19 state fiscal year, 4 \$500,000 is appropriated to the department of public safety for use by the 5 office of preparedness. This appropriation is from the school safety 6 resource center cash fund created in section 24-33.5-1807, C.R.S. To 7 implement this act, the office may use this appropriation for the enhance 8 school safety incident response grant program.

9 SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
10 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
11 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
