HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 21-1002 SUBMITTING TO THE REGISTERED ELECTORS OF THE STATE OF COLORADO AN AMENDMENT TO THE COLORADO CONSTITUTION CONCERNING THE EXTENSION OF THE PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION FOR QUALIFYING SENIORS AND DISABLED VETERANS TO THE GOLD STAR SPOUSES OF DECEASED MEMBERS OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES.

who has a service-connected disability rated as a 100% permanent disability to claim a property tax exemption for 50% of the first \$200,000 of actual value of the qualifying senior's or veteran's owner-occupied primary residence. The concurrent resolution extends eligibility for the exemption to the gold star spouse of a veteran. Gold star spouse is defined as the spouse of a deceased member of the United States armed forces who qualifies for a gold star lapel button due to the death of the member of the United States armed forces under applicable federal law and regulations prescribed by the federal secretary of defense.

1 Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-third 2 *General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:* 3 **SECTION 1.** At the election held on November 8, 2022, the 4 secretary of state shall submit to the registered electors of the state the 5 ballot title set forth in section 2 for the following amendment to the state 6 constitution: 7 In the constitution of the state of Colorado, section 3.5 of article 8 X, **add** (1)(d) and (1.7) as follows: 9 Section 3.5. Homestead exemption for qualifying senior 10 citizens, disabled veterans, and gold star spouses. (1) For property tax 11 years commencing on or after January 1, 2002, fifty percent of the first 12 two hundred thousand dollars of actual value of residential real property, 13 as defined by law, that, as of the assessment date, is owner-occupied and 14 is used as the primary residence of the owner-occupier shall be exempt 15 from property taxation if: 16 (d) FOR PROPERTY TAX YEARS COMMENCING ON OR AFTER 17 JANUARY 1, 2023, ONLY, THE OWNER-OCCUPIER, AS OF THE ASSESSMENT 18 DATE, IS A GOLD STAR SPOUSE. 19 (1.7) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "GOLD STAR SPOUSE" MEANS 20 THE SPOUSE OF A DECEASED MEMBER OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED

13	voting on the ballot title vote "Yes/For", then the amendment will become
14	part of the state constitution.
