HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 17-1009

101 **CONCERNING COMMEMORATING THE SEVENTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY**
102 **OF THE ATTACK ON PEARL HARBOR.**

1 WHEREAS, On December 7, 1941, a "date which will live in
2 infamy", Japanese forces launched a surprise attack against the United
3 States Naval base at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii; 2,403 Americans were killed
4 and 1,178 were wounded; and

5 WHEREAS, This act of aggression ended the United States' policy
6 of non-interventionism and propelled the United States into direct military
7 action in World War II, during which millions of brave men and women
8 from the United States armed forces and other Allied powers defeated the
9 Axis powers across the globe; and

10 WHEREAS, Following the attack on Pearl Harbor, Colorado

1 became key to the United States' war effort with vital training facilities at
2 Camp Hale, near Leadville, and Camp Carson, near Colorado Springs;

3 WHEREAS, Numerous survivors of the attack on Pearl Harbor
4 have made Colorado their home, though the passage of time is taking
5 these last Pearl Harbor survivors from us;

6 WHEREAS, December 7, 2016, marked the seventy-fifth
7 anniversary of the Japanese attack on the United States Naval base at
8 Pearl Harbor, Hawaii; now, therefore,

9 *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-first*
10 *General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:*

11 That we, the members of the Seventy-first General Assembly:

12 (1) Extend our heartfelt gratitude for the service and sacrifice of
13 all those who experienced the attack on Pearl Harbor;

14 (2) Remain dedicated to preserving the memory of this event and
15 encourage all of Colorado's citizens to do the same;

16 (3) Honor and remember the seventy-fifth anniversary of the
17 attack on Pearl Harbor.

18 *Be It Further Resolved,* That copies of this Joint Resolution be sent
19 to President Donald J. Trump; Governor John Hickenlooper; and
20 Colorado's Congressional delegation.
