WHEREAS, Today, 98% of all U.S. farms are family-owned, and each American farmer feeds more than 156 people, a dramatic increase

from the 1960s, when each farmer could feed only 25 people; and

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, Americans spend less than 10% of their annual income on food, less than any other developed nation, while American farmers and ranchers receive only 12 cents of every dollar spent on food; and
5 6 7	WHEREAS, American farmers and ranchers are the most capable and responsible providers for the safety, health, and well-being of their livestock; and
8 9 10	WHEREAS, The agriculture industry is the second largest industry in Colorado, supporting more than 173,000 jobs in Colorado and contributing \$41 billion to the state's economy; and
11 12	WHEREAS, Colorado was responsible for exporting more than \$2 billion in food and agricultural products in 2012; and
13 14	WHEREAS, Colorado agriculture contributes to national security not only by providing food and fiber, but also by producing energy; and
15 16 17	WHEREAS, Colorado recognizes landowners whose livelihood depends upon the property they reside on, operate on, and care for as they work to provide basic necessities to all; and
18 19 20	WHEREAS, Colorado's agriculture industry requires an adequate, reliable work force in order to provide food from the field to the table; and
21 22 23	WHEREAS, Colorado's farms and ranches provide wildlife habitats, open space, and a site for innovative and sustainable farming practices that ensure the protection of state resources; and
