101 MEMORIALIZING FORMER STATE REPRESENTATIVE RICHARD "RICH"  
102 GEBHARDT.

1 WHEREAS, Our respected former colleague Richard "Rich"  
2 Gebhardt, a past member of the Colorado House of Representatives,  
3 departed this life on February 13, 2017, at the age of 85; and

4 WHEREAS, Richard Glenn Gebhardt was born in Denver,  
5 Colorado, on May 18, 1931, and at the age of two-and-a-half was adopted  
6 by Glenn and Dora Gebhardt, both public school teachers; and

7 WHEREAS, Representative Gebhardt grew up in Denver and  
8 spent his summers traveling the western United States with his father,  
9 Glenn, who was a photographer; and

10 WHEREAS, After graduating from South High School,  
11 Representative Gebhardt enlisted in the United States Army at age 19 and  
12 served as a medic in the Korean War; and

13 WHEREAS, During the last big drive of the war, Representative  
14 Gebhardt's battalion was cut off from the rest of his group and during the

1       ensuing battle he was hit by shrapnel in the leg and abdomen. His  
2       battalion was overrun by the North Koreans and he and a group of  
3       soldiers were taken as prisoners; and

4               WHEREAS, Representative Gebhardt was rescued, and in July  
5       1953 was honorably discharged as a Corporal and awarded the First Oak  
6       Leaf Cluster, the CIB Medical Badge, and the Purple Heart; and

7               WHEREAS, When he returned to Colorado, Representative  
8       Gebhardt attended the University of Colorado at Boulder, graduating with  
9       a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science and Economics in 1957 and a  
10       Masters of Public Administration in 1958, and during his time at school  
11       was elected to student body government; and

12              WHEREAS, In the early 1960s, Representative Gebhardt began  
13       pursuing his interest in politics when he worked on John F. Kennedy's  
14       presidential campaign, and pursued many congressional and legislative  
15       causes, including the 1960s Civil Rights Movement; and

16              WHEREAS, Representative Gebhardt carried this quote from John  
17       F. Kennedy in his wallet: "War marks you forever. While you need to  
18       move to your future you cannot let go of what you had witnessed and  
19       what you had learned. One thing learned is that you are capable of  
20       personal courage when the need is thrust upon you. However, one  
21       singular crucial idea you grasp from the experience of war is that war is  
22       wrong and when you return home you must take the life of your country  
23       seriously which means that the rest of the life you have been given as a  
24       survivor means doing all you can to prevent another war."; and

25              WHEREAS, In 1965, Representative Gebhardt was elected to the  
26       Colorado House of Representatives and served two terms as the first  
27       Democrat elected in Boulder County in 16 years; and

28              WHEREAS, During his time in the state legislature, he ran the first  
29       legislation to establish hospice care, though the legislation would not pass  
30       for another 10 years; and

31              WHEREAS, Representative Gebhardt was the Western Regional  
32       Campaign Chairman for Robert Kennedy's campaign for president,  
33       traveling with Robert Kennedy to the south during the Civil Rights  
34       Movement, and also served as a Colorado coordinator for Ted Kennedy's  
35       campaign for president; and

1           WHEREAS, Representative Gebhardt was the Democratic  
2 candidate for the United States House of Representatives Second  
3 Congressional District in 1970; and

4           WHEREAS, For 25 years, Representative Gebhardt served as  
5 Boulder County Public Trustee, serving under four Colorado governors,  
6 and he worked for Northwestern Mutual Life for 53 years; and

7           WHEREAS, Representative Gebhardt loved the outdoors, calling  
8 himself a naturalist, and loved spending time in the mountains at his cabin  
9 and near the ocean in Maui, Hawaii; and

10           WHEREAS, Representative Gebhardt was an avid sports fan. He  
11 especially loved basketball, and for many years he served as the official  
12 timekeeper for the University of Colorado men's basketball team; and

13           WHEREAS, Representative Gebhardt loved taking his grandkids  
14 for rides in his Jeep; was known for never missing a birthday, singing and  
15 playing the harmonica for each family member; and shared special  
16 conversations over breakfasts with his family, which will be sorely  
17 missed but fondly remembered; and

18           WHEREAS, It is fitting that we, the members of the House of  
19 Representatives of the Seventy-first General Assembly, pay tribute to the  
20 dedicated service of Representative Richard "Rich" Gebhardt and express  
21 our deep regret and sorrow occasioned by his death; now, therefore,

22           *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-first*  
23 *General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

24           That, in the death of Richard Glenn Gebhardt, the people of the  
25 State of Colorado have lost a devoted public servant and an outstanding  
26 citizen, and that we, the members of the House of Representatives of the  
27 Seventy-first General Assembly, pay tribute to Richard Gebhardt for his  
28 years of dedicated public service and do hereby extend our deep and  
29 heartfelt sympathy to the members of his family.

30           *Be It Further Resolved,* That copies of this Memorial be sent to  
31 Representative Gebhardt's daughter, Kathy Gebhardt.
