<b>HOUSE RESOLUTION 18-1004</b>
CONCERNING RECOGNITION OF THE URGENT AND IMMEDIATE NEED
FOR CONGRESS TO PASS A PERMANENT LEGISLATIVE SOLUTION
THAT SUPPORTS POLICIES AND AN IMMIGRATION SYSTEM THAT
WILL POSITIVELY IMPACT DREAMERS.
WHEREAS, Dreamers, after the federal "DREAM Act", play a
vital role in our national, state, and local economies; and
WHEREAS, In the United States, there are 800,000 Dreamers,
with over 95% who are either working or in school, contributing to our
communities and economy; and
WHEREAS, There are 17,300 Deferred Action for Childhood
Arrivals (DACA) recipients in Colorado who came to the United States
as children, and their futures have been at risk since DACA was rescinded
in September 2017; and
WHEREAS, According to several surveys, the majority of the
American public overwhelmingly supports giving Dreamers the chance
to stay permanently in this country; and

1	WHEREAS, Colorado risks an annual GDP loss of \$856.9 million
2	if Dreamers are no longer guaranteed the right to work and study in the
3	state; and
4	WHEREAS, The Colorado House of Representatives believes that
5	tax dollars should be used efficiently on sensible border security and not
6	on deporting Dreamers who have been living peacefully in our
7	communities; and
8	WHEREAS, Families should be kept together because they are the
9	basic unit of society and should not live in fear of being separated from
10	their loved ones; and
11	WHEREAS, The Colorado House of Representatives supports an
12	immigration system and policies that encourage opportunities and
13	positively impact our economy and recognizes that Dreamers help to
14	grow the economy; now, therefore,
15	Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-first
16	General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
17	(1) That members of the Colorado House of Representatives stand
18	by the economic and cultural contributions that DACA recipients, as well
19	as Dreamers who were left out of the program, have made for the people
20	of Colorado;
21	(2) That members of the Colorado House of Representatives
22	recognize that the possibility of Dreamers losing their work authorization
23	and deportation protections would have devastating and far-reaching
24	job-loss consequences for all Americans; and
25	(3) That members of the Colorado House of Representatives urge
26	Colorado's congressional delegation to support efforts to immediately find
27	a collaborative and rational approach to passing a permanent legislative
28	solution that allows Dreamers to secure legal status.
29	Be It Further Resolved, That copies of this Resolution be sent to
30	Colorado's congressional delegation.
