HOUSE RESOLUTION 19-1005 101 CONCERNING GIVING CONSUMERS NOTICE OF CELL-CULTURED MEAT 102 PRODUCTS. 1 WHEREAS, Section 25-5-411, Colorado Revised Statutes, 2 declares a food misbranded if its labeling or packaging is false or 3 misleading in any particular; and 4 WHEREAS, Consumers have a right to know what is in their food and to have nationally approved labeling standards for food in Colorado; 5 6 and 7 WHEREAS, The United States Department of Agriculture 8 (USDA) publishes an Institutional Meat Purchase Specifications guide 9 that standardizes meat cuts from harvested livestock in order to provide 10 clarity and criteria for consumers; and 11 WHEREAS, The USDA and the Food and Drug Administration 12 (FDA) have announced a framework in which the FDA oversees cell 13 collection, cell banks, cell growth, and differentiation of cell-cultured 14 food or meat products, and the Food Safety and Inspection Service within 15 the USDA oversees the production and labeling of food-meat products

1	derived from cells of meat animals; now, therefore,
2	Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the
3	Seventy-second General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
4	That we, the members of the House of Representatives of the
5	Colorado General Assembly, ask that the United States Department of
6	Agriculture and the Food and Drug Administration expedite necessary
7	rule-making to require accurate food labeling to educate and inform
8	consumers and authorize subsequent enforcement to provide accurate
9	labeling of cell-cultured food.
