	constitution provides that one member of the Independent Ethics	
	Commission created in section 5 (1) of that article, hereafter referred to	
	as the "Commission", shall be appointed by the House of Representatives,	
	and section 24-18.5-101 (2)(a), Colorado Revised Statutes, provides that	
	said appointment shall be made by the Speaker of the House of	
	Representatives with the approval of two-thirds of the members elected	
	to the House; and	
	WHEREAS, Pursuant to such authority, Speaker K.C. Becker	
	appoints Luis Toro to the Independent Ethics Commission to succeed	
	Commissioner April Jones upon the conclusion of her term; and	
	WHEREAS, The Speaker makes such appointment based on, and	
	in recognition of, Mr. Toro's outstanding qualifications, his unique	
	knowledge and experience in the field of ethics, and his demonstrated	
	integrity and leadership; and	

WHEREAS, Mr. Toro, designated as an unaffiliated elector, is a licensed attorney in Colorado and is currently a Senior Assistant City Attorney for the City of Boulder; and
