A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING AN EXTENSION OF THE DATE BY WHICH THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY MUST SUBMIT TO THE JOINT BUDGET COMMITTEE A REPORT REGARDING STATEWIDE RADIO COMMUNICATIONS.

Bill Summary

Senate Bill 14-127 required the executive director of the department of public safety to submit to the joint budget committee a report setting forth findings and conclusions of a statewide radio

communications needs assessment and business plan. The bill extends the date by which the report must be submitted.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-716, amend 3 (7) (a) as follows: 4 24-33.5-716. Interoperable communications among public 5 safety radio systems - statewide plan - regional plans - governmental 6 immunity - needs assessment - definitions - repeal. (7) (a) The 7 executive director, in consultation with the public safety communications 8 subcommittee created in section 24-33.5-1614 (3.3), shall perform a 9 needs assessment and create a business plan regarding statewide radio 10 communications. The executive director shall submit a report regarding 11 the findings and conclusions of the needs assessment and business plan 12 to the joint budget committee on or before December 31, 2014 APRIL 30, 13 2015. 14 **SECTION 2.** Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, 15 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 16 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
