A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE CREATION OF THE COLORADO BUSINESS RETENTION

102 AND EXPANSION PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. In order to retain and grow existing businesses in the state, the bill directs the Colorado office of economic development (office) to develop and administer the Colorado business retention and expansion program under the office's statewide economic development plan. The bill describes the office's specific duties under the program, including the

requirement that the office annually report on the program to the general assembly.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly 3 hereby finds, determines, and declares that: 4 A clear economic strategy is paramount to enhancing 5 Colorado's competitiveness as measured by increased productivity and 6 more effective utilization of talent, capital, and natural resources; 7 (b) Existing Colorado businesses, which provide jobs for local 8 residents and support the tax bases of the state and local governments, are 9 critical to building a stable and competitive state economy; 10 (c) An effective economic strategy must include a proactive and 11 opportunity-based approach to efficaciously retain and expand existing 12 Colorado businesses: 13 (d) Aligning public and private resources in a way that helps to 14 retain and expand existing Colorado businesses will also enhance and 15 create job opportunities in Colorado; and 16 (e) Developing a retention and expansion program and 17 public-private partnerships across the state will therefore ultimately 18 contribute to an environment that produces sustainable economic growth 19 and job creation. 20 (2) The general assembly further finds and declares that a robust 21 business retention and expansion program will: 22 (a) Provide an opportunity to approach and engage partners and 23 businesses across the state in a consistent manner and thus gather 24 meaningful information about their needs, barriers, and opportunities for 25 growth;

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1	(b) Build upon "Colorado Blueprint: A bottom-up approach to
2	economic development", the state's document outlining a series of key
3	tactical steps designed to foster a more competitive Colorado, by helping
4	the state achieve the following six core objectives:
5	(I) Build a business-friendly environment;
6	(II) Retain, grow, and recruit companies;
7	(III) Increase access to capital;
8	(IV) Create and market a stronger Colorado brand;
9	(V) Educate and train the workforce of the future; and
10	(VI) Cultivate innovation and technology; and
11	(c) Translate directly into tangible benefits for businesses,
12	citizens, and educational institutions by enabling businesses to work
13	together to reduce barriers, increase competitiveness, and expedite job
14	growth.
15	(3) It is therefore the intent of the general assembly to instruct and
16	empower the Colorado office of economic development, as a key
17	component of the state economic development plan and pursuant to the
18	tactics set forth in "Colorado Blueprint: A bottom-up approach to
19	economic development", to develop and implement protocols and
20	procedures to retain and expand existing businesses. The program will be
21	a proactive and opportunity-based initiative forged through partnerships
22	with local economic development organizations in order to maintain and
23	grow businesses and jobs in Colorado.
24	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 24-48.5-114 as
25	follows:
26	24-48.5-114. Business retention and expansion program -
27	creation - duties - report - definitions. (1) As used in this section,

5	WHICH WAS ISSUED ON OCTOBER 18, 2011. THE TERM INCLUDES
6	SUBSEQUENT VERSIONS.
7	(b) "Office" means the Colorado office of economic
8	DEVELOPMENT CREATED IN SECTION 24-48.5-101.
9	(c) "PARTNER" MEANS ALL STATE, REGIONAL, AND LOCAL
10	ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PARTNERS IN COLORADO.
11	(d) "PROGRAM" MEANS THE BUSINESS RETENTION AND EXPANSION
12	PROGRAM CREATED IN SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION.
13	(e) "STATE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PLAN" MEANS THE PLAN
14	DEVELOPED BY THE OFFICE PURSUANT TO, AND BASED ON THE
15	FRAMEWORK OUTLINED IN, THE BLUEPRINT.
16	(2) AS PART OF THE STATE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PLAN, AND
17	Pursuant to its duties under section 24-48.5-102 (1) (a), the office
18	SHALL DEVELOP A BUSINESS RETENTION AND EXPANSION PROGRAM TO
19	IDENTIFY AND RESPOND TO RETENTION AND EXPANSION ISSUES FACED BY
20	BUSINESSES IN THE STATE.
21	(3) THE OFFICE HAS THE FOLLOWING DUTIES UNDER THE PROGRAM:
22	(a) TO DEVELOP STRONGER RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN PARTNERS
23	IN ORDER TO:
24	(I) PROVIDE A TRANSPARENT UNDERSTANDING OF THE STATE
25	ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT PLAN SO THAT PARTNERS CAN IDENTIFY THEIR
26	ROLES WITHIN THAT PLAN;
27	(II) CREATE A COLLABORATIVE, COORDINATED, AND CONSISTENT

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1	APPROACH TO:
2	(A) ENGAGING AND SUPPORTING EXISTING BUSINESSES IN EACH
3	PARTNER'S REGION; AND
4	(B) GATHERING MEANINGFUL INFORMATION ABOUT THE NEEDS,
5	BARRIERS TO, AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR GROWTH FOR EXISTING
6	BUSINESSES;
7	(III) ENHANCE PARTNERS' UNDERSTANDING AND AWARENESS,
8	THROUGH WEBINARS, SEMINARS, AND OTHER METHODS OF TRAINING, OF:
9	(A) THE RESOURCES, GRANTS, POLICY INITIATIVES, AND OTHER
10	PROGRAMS AVAILABLE FROM LOCAL, STATE, AND FEDERAL ENTITIES; AND
11	(B) THE STRUCTURE AND ORGANIZATION OF, AND CHANGES TO,
12	THE OFFICE;
13	(IV) PROVIDE THE PARTNERS WITH ACCESS TO THE CRITICAL DATA
14	THEY NEED TO MAKE STRATEGIC AND PROACTIVE DECISIONS REGARDING
15	BUSINESSES WITHIN THEIR REGION;
16	(V) COLLABORATE WITH PARTNERS TO DEVELOP AN EARLY
17	DETECTION-AND-RESPONSE SYSTEM TO:
18	(A) ANTICIPATE AND IDENTIFY BUSINESSES' NEEDS AND
19	CHALLENGES; AND
20	(B) FOSTER AN EXPEDITIOUS PROCESS TO FIND AND IMPLEMENT
21	NECESSARY SOLUTIONS;
22	(b) TO SERVE AS A CLEARINGHOUSE OF PROGRAMS, RESOURCES,
23	POLICY INITIATIVES, GRANTS AND OTHER FUNDING, AND OTHER MEANS OF
24	ASSISTANCE WITH RETENTION AND EXPANSION OF BUSINESSES;
25	(c) TO SUPPORT AND FACILITATE COMMUNICATION AND BUILD
26	STRONGER RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, PARTNERS,
27	AND THEIR LOCAL BUSINESS COMMUNITY: AND

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1	(d) TO DEVELOP PROTOCOLS AND PROCEDURES TO IDENTIFY
2	OPPORTUNITIES TO RETAIN AND EXPAND EXISTING BUSINESSES THROUGH
3	SWIFT AND EFFECTIVE RESPONSES TO CONCERNS AND PROBLEMS ON A
4	STATEWIDE OR REGIONAL LEVEL.
5	(4) THE OFFICE SHALL ALIGN THE PROGRAM'S RESOURCES WITH
6	OTHER STATE, REGIONAL, AND LOCAL PROGRAMS THROUGH FOCUSED,
7	DIRECT PARTICIPATION OF THE OFFICE, ENSURING THAT SUCH RESOURCES
8	ARE UTILIZED IN AN EFFICIENT AND EFFECTIVE MANNER FOR STABILIZING
9	AND GROWING COLORADO'S EXISTING BUSINESSES AND FOR PROVIDING A
10	STRONG BASE FROM WHICH TO RETAIN AND EXPAND COLORADO
11	BUSINESSES.
12	(5) THE OFFICE SHALL INCLUDE A REPORT ON THE PROGRAM IN THE
13	OFFICE'S ANNUAL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
14	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
15	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
16	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
