CONCERNING THE USE OF A VIDEO DISPLAY WHILE DRIVING A MOTOR

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Currently, it is illegal to have a screen that receives a television broadcast at any point forward of the driver's seat or visible to the driver. The bill allows the screen to be forward of the driver's seat so long as visual entertainment is not visible to the driver and clarifies that it is the display of video programming, not the reception of television, that triggers the prohibition.

15	SECTION 2. Effective date - applicability. This act shall take

19	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
20	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
