## **Bill Summary**

**Legislative Audit Committee.** Anhydrous ammonia is a hazardous chemical compound that is regulated by various entities. In Colorado, anhydrous ammonia that is used as an agricultural fertilizer is overseen by the inspection and consumer services division in the

department of agriculture (department).

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Following its 2010 performance audit of the department's anhydrous ammonia program, the office of the state auditor (OSA) recommended various ways to improve the program. The bill implements the OSA's recommendation that the department work with the general assembly to develop incident reporting requirements for anhydrous ammonia used as an agricultural fertilizer.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
