A BILL FOR AN ACT

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Police Officers' and Firefighters' Pension Reform Commission. The bill modifies the administration of volunteer firefighter pension plans that are affiliated with the fire and police pension association (association). For volunteer firefighter pension plans that are affiliated with the association, the bill directs the department of local affairs to distribute any state moneys that it receives for funding volunteer firefighter pension plans to the association to be credited to the assets of the plan for which they were transferred.

The bill specifies the responsibilities of the association in connection with volunteer firefighter pension plans with which the association is affiliated, including investing the assets of the plan, collecting and accounting for contributions to the plan, distributing plan benefits, conducting actuarial valuations of the plan, maintaining records and fulfilling reporting requirements, and authorizing the payment of expenses of the plan from the assets of the plan.

The bill also specifies the responsibilities of the governing body of a volunteer firefighter pension plan that is affiliated with the association, including establishing eligibility for the plan and the amount of benefits for plan members and beneficiaries, electing options for the allocation of assets, maintaining records of the terms and provisions of the plan, determining benefit improvements, and certifying information required by the association to administer the plan benefits.

In addition, the bill states how the governing body of a volunteer firefighter pension plan may terminate its affiliation with the association and how the association may terminate its affiliation with a volunteer firefighter pension plan.

2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 31-30-1108, amend
3	(1) (d) as follows:
4	31-30-1108. Board powers and duties. (1) A board created by

9	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 31-30-1112, amend
10	(1) as follows:
11	31-30-1112. State contributions - intent - advisory committee
12	- repeal. (1) (a) Prior to July 1, 2004, the state treasurer may transfer
13	moneys annually to the fire and police pension association for distribution

as provided in this section to assist in funding volunteer firefighter
 pension funds.

3 (b) On and after July 1, 2004, the state treasurer shall transfer 4 moneys to the department of local affairs for distribution as provided in 5 this section to assist in funding volunteer firefighter pension plans. THE 6 DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS SHALL DISTRIBUTE MONEYS FOR FUNDING 7 VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER PENSION PLANS AFFILIATED WITH THE FIRE AND 8 POLICE PENSION ASSOCIATION PURSUANT TO SECTION 31-31-705 DIRECTLY 9 TO THE FIRE AND POLICE PENSION ASSOCIATION AS THE ADMINISTRATOR 10 OF THE PLAN. THE ASSOCIATION SHALL CREDIT THE TRANSFERRED MONEYS 11 TO THE ASSETS OF THE PLAN FOR WHICH THEY ARE TRANSFERRED.

SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 31-31-705 as
 follows:

31-31-705. Affiliation by volunteer pension plans. (1) The
board is authorized to make AFFILIATION agreements with governing
bodies that provide pension plans for volunteer firefighters to administer
such plans and manage the funds of such plans for investment. THE FIRE
AND POLICE PENSION ASSOCIATION MAY REQUIRE PERIODIC RENEWAL OF
THE AGREEMENT.

(2) THE FIRE AND POLICE PENSION ASSOCIATION HAS THE
FOLLOWING RESPONSIBILITIES IN CONNECTION WITH A VOLUNTEER
FIREFIGHTER PENSION PLAN THAT HAS AN AGREEMENT WITH THE
ASSOCIATION PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION:

24 (a) INVESTING THE ASSETS OF THE PLAN, INCLUDING DETERMINING
25 THE ALLOCATION OF ASSETS;

26 (b) COLLECTING AND ACCOUNTING FOR CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE27 PLAN;

(c) DISTRIBUTING BENEFITS PROVIDED UNDER THE PLAN AS
 DIRECTED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OR ITS AGENT AND ISSUING TAX
 FORMS AND FILING TAX REPORTS REGARDING DISTRIBUTIONS;

4 (d) CONDUCTING ACTUARIAL VALUATIONS AND FINANCIAL AUDITS
5 OF THE PLAN ON AT LEAST A BIANNUAL BASIS OR AS REQUIRED BY
6 REGULATORY BODIES OR BY LAW;

7 (e) MAINTAINING RECORDS AND REPORTING THE INVESTMENTS,
8 ASSETS, AND BENEFITS OF THE PLAN AS REQUIRED BY STATUTE OR BY
9 REGULATORY BODIES;

10 (f) AUTHORIZING THE PAYMENT OF EXPENSES OF THE PLAN FROM 11 THE ASSETS OF THE PLAN. ANY EXPENSES THAT ARE INCURRED BY THE 12 FIRE AND POLICE PENSION ASSOCIATION THAT ARE DIRECTLY RELATED TO 13 THE ASSOCIATION'S ADMINISTRATION OF THE PLAN SHALL BE PAID FROM 14 THAT PLAN'S ASSETS. ANY EXPENSES INCURRED BY THE ASSOCIATION 15 THAT ARE ATTRIBUTABLE TO MORE THAN ONE PLAN ADMINISTERED BY THE 16 ASSOCIATION SHALL BE ALLOCATED TO EACH PLAN ON AN EQUITABLE 17 BASIS AS DETERMINED BY THE ASSOCIATION. THE ALLOCATED EXPENSE 18 SHALL BE PAID FROM THE ASSETS OF EACH PLAN.

19 (g) TAKING SUCH OTHER ACTIONS AS MAY BE ALLOWED OR20 REQUIRED BY STATUTE.

(3) THE GOVERNING BODY OF A VOLUNTEER PENSION PLAN OR ITS
LOCAL PENSION BOARD HAS THE FOLLOWING RESPONSIBILITIES WHEN THE
PLAN IS AFFILIATED WITH THE FIRE AND POLICE PENSION ASSOCIATION
PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION:

(a) ESTABLISHING ELIGIBILITY FOR AND THE AMOUNT OF BENEFITS
TO BE RECEIVED BY MEMBERS AND BENEFICIARIES OF THE PLAN,
INCLUDING THE DETERMINATION OF BASE BENEFITS, YEARS OF SERVICE

UNDER THE PLAN, MARITAL STATUS, AND CONTINUING ELIGIBILITY OF
 RETIREES AND SURVIVORS;

3 (b) ELECTING OPTIONS FOR THE ALLOCATION OF ASSETS, IF SUCH
4 OPTIONS ARE PROVIDED BY THE FIRE AND POLICE PENSION ASSOCIATION;
5 (c) MAINTAINING RECORDS OF THE TERMS AND PROVISIONS OF THE
6 PLAN AS THEY MAY BE ADOPTED AND AMENDED;

7 (d) Making determinations regarding benefit
8 improvements, if any; and

9 (e) PERIODICALLY CERTIFYING INFORMATION REQUIRED BY THE 10 FIRE AND POLICE PENSION ASSOCIATION TO ADMINISTER THE PLAN 11 BENEFITS.

12 (4) A GOVERNING BODY THAT PROVIDES PENSION BENEFITS FOR 13 VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS MAY TERMINATE ITS AFFILIATION WITH THE 14 FIRE AND POLICE PENSION ASSOCIATION UPON GIVING WRITTEN NOTICE TO 15 THE ASSOCIATION AT LEAST SIXTY DAYS PRIOR TO THE END OF ANY 16 QUARTER OF A CALENDAR YEAR. THE ASSOCIATION MAY ALLOW A 17 SHORTER NOTICE PERIOD. THE ASSOCIATION MAY TERMINATE THE 18 AFFILIATION OF A VOLUNTEER PLAN UPON SIXTY DAYS WRITTEN NOTICE TO 19 THE GOVERNING BODY FOR FAILURE TO FULFILL ITS RESPONSIBILITIES TO 20 THE PLAN OR ITS FAILURE TO RENEW AN AFFILIATION AGREEMENT.

SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
