# A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING ACCOUNTABILITY FOR STATE PROCUREMENT, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, ENACTING THE "COLORADO TAXPAYER EMPOWERMENT ACT OF 2011".

## **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill enacts the "Colorado Taxpayer Empowerment Act of 2011". Current law makes state procurement information available to the public. **Section 2** of the bill requires each contract entered into by a governmental body under the state "Procurement Code" to contain a

provision reflecting this current law and specifies that, with the exception of records exempt from inspection under the "Colorado Open Records Act", upon request, records relating to the costs of or any performance measures under the contract are available to the contracting governmental body, the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, the minority leaders of the senate and house of representatives, and legislative oversight committees of the general assembly. Authorizes the executive director of the department of personnel and administration to promulgate rules for the administration of the provisions enacted in the bill.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 1 2 **SECTION 1. Short title.** This act shall be known and may be 3 cited as the "Colorado Taxpayer Empowerment Act of 2011". 4 **SECTION 2.** 24-101-401, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended 5 to read: 6 24-101-401. Public access to procurement information - rules. 7 Except as provided in section 24-103-202 (4), procurement (1) 8 information shall be IS a public record and shall be IS available to the 9 public as provided in sections 24-72-203 and 24-72-204. 10 (2) (a) EACH CONTRACT ENTERED INTO BY A GOVERNMENTAL 11 BODY PURSUANT TO THIS CODE SHALL SPECIFY THAT THE CONTRACT IS 12 OPEN TO INSPECTION BY THE PUBLIC. 13 (b) EXCEPT FOR RECORDS EXEMPT FROM INSPECTION UNDER 14 SECTION 24-72-204, UPON REQUEST, THE VENDOR SHALL MAKE AVAILABLE 15 TO THE CONTRACTING GOVERNMENTAL BODY RECORDS RELATING TO THE 16 COSTS OF, OR ANY PERFORMANCE MEASURE UNDER, THE CONTRACT. IN 17 ADDITION, THE RECORDS MUST BE MADE AVAILABLE, UPON REQUEST, TO 18 THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF 19 REPRESENTATIVES, THE MINORITY LEADERS OF THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF 20 REPRESENTATIVES, AND LEGISLATIVE OVERSIGHT COMMITTEES OF THE

1	GENERAL ASSEMBLY, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE JOINT BUDGET
2	COMMITTEE, THE LEGISLATIVE AUDIT COMMITTEE, AND SUCH OTHER
