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### A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING LIMITS ON GOVERNMENTAL ACTIONS RELATED TO LAWFUL PROTESTS.

## **Bill Summary**

The bill prohibits a state, county, or local government agency, or any person acting on behalf of the state, county, or local government agency, from ordering persons participating in a protest or demonstration (protest) to disperse, or from deeming the protest unlawful, unless the persons participating in the protest are acting in concert to pose an imminent threat to use force or violence to cause personal injury or

- 3 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this

- 5 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
- 6 November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
- 7 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
