#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING MOTORCYCLE SAFETY EDUCATION PROGRAMS.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

**Section 2** of the bill creates a program to raise motorists' awareness of safely using the road with motorcycles, funded by using 5% of the motorcycle operator safety training fund. **Section 1** limits the use of the motorcycle operator safety training fund moneys to providing motorcycle training tuition for students and travel reimbursement for instructors. In addition, section 1 sets a maximum tuition level.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. This act is not intended
3	to authorize an increase in the amount of the fees collected pursuant to
4	sections 42-2-114 (2) (b) and (4) (b), 42-2-118 (1) (b) (II), and 42-3-304
5	(4), C.R.S.
6	<b>SECTION</b> <u>2.</u> 43-5-504, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended
7	to read:
8	<b>43-5-504.</b> Motorcycle operator safety training fund. (1) There
9	is hereby created in the state treasury a motorcycle operator safety
10	training fund, which shall consist of moneys collected pursuant to
11	sections 42-2-114 (2) (b) and (4) (b), 42-2-118 (1) (b) (II), and 42-3-304
12	(4), C.R.S. The moneys in the fund shall be available immediately,
13	without further appropriation, for allocation by the transportation
14	commission to the office of transportation safety to be used for the
15	implementation and administration of the program. Moneys credited to
16	the fund shall remain therein IN THE FUND at the end of each fiscal year
17	and shall not be transferred to any other fund.
18	(2) THE OFFICE SHALL USE FIVE PERCENT OF THE MONEYS IN THE
19	FUND TO IMPLEMENT SECTION 43-5-506.
20	(3) The office shall distribute eighty percent of the
21	MONEYS IN THE FUND ONLY FOR TUITION SUBSIDIZATION BASED UPON THE
22	NUMBER OF STUDENTS TRAINED BY THE PROGRAM USING A TUITION
23	SYSTEM; EXCEPT THAT A PROGRAM SPONSOR MAY BE REIMBURSED FOR
24	EXPENSES OCCURRING AS A RESULT OF TRAVELING TO PROVIDE A
25	PROGRAM TO AN AREA WITHOUT A PERMANENT TRAINING SITE.
26	(4) THE OFFICE SHALL ANNUALLY SET A MAXIMUM TUITION PER

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1	STUDENT THAT MAY BE CHARGED TO STUDENTS IN ORDER TO ENABLE THE
2	MAXIMUM NUMBER OF STUDENTS TO OBTAIN SAFETY TRAINING.
3	SECTION 3. Part 5 of article 5 of title 43, Colorado Revised
4	Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION to
5	read:
6	<b>43-5-506. Motorist awareness.</b> The office shall create a
7	PROGRAM TO RAISE MOTORISTS' AWARENESS CONCERNING SAFE
8	INTERACTION BETWEEN MOTORCYCLES AND OTHER MOTOR VEHICLES. THE
9	PROGRAM MAY INCLUDE PLACING SIGNS AT PLACES KNOWN TO BE
10	HAZARDOUS TO MOTORCYCLES AND PROMOTING A MOTORCYCLE
11	AWARENESS MONTH.
12	SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
13	shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
14	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
15	11, 2010, if adjournment sine die is on May 12, 2010); except that, if a
16	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
17	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
18	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part shall not take effect
19	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
20	November 2010 and shall take effect on the date of the official
21	declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
