A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING INCREASING THE STATUTE OF LIMITATIONS FOR CERTAIN**

102 FAILURE TO REPORT CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE CRIMES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill makes the statute of limitations 5 years for failure to report child abuse when a child makes a verbal or written allegation of unlawful sexual behavior to a mandatory reporter.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 19-3-304, add (5) as
 follows:

3 **19-3-304.** Persons required to report child abuse or neglect. 4 (5) NO PERSON SHALL BE PROSECUTED, TRIED, OR PUNISHED FOR AN 5 OFFENSE THAT PERTAINS TO A REPORT OF UNLAWFUL SEXUAL BEHAVIOR 6 AS DEFINED IN SECTION 16-22-102(9) and under circumstances when 7 A CHILD HAS MADE A VERBAL OR WRITTEN ALLEGATION OF THE ABUSE TO 8 A MANDATORY REPORTER AS DESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION UNLESS THE 9 INDICTMENT, INFORMATION, COMPLAINT, OR ACTION FOR THE SAME IS 10 FOUND OR INSTITUTED WITHIN FIVE YEARS AFTER THE COMMISSION OF THE 11 OFFENSE. THE LIMITATION FOR COMMENCING CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS 12 CONCERNING ACTS OF FAILURE TO REPORT CHILD ABUSE OTHER THAN 13 THOSE INVOLVING ACTS DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBSECTION (5) ARE 14 GOVERNED BY SECTION 16-5-401.

15 SECTION 2. Applicability. This act applies to offenses
16 committed on or after the effective date of this act.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
