A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE GOVERNOR'S AUTHORITY TO RESTRICT THE DISTRIBUTION OF FIREARMS DURING A STATE OF DISASTER EMERGENCY.

Bill Summary

Eliminates the authority of the governor to suspend or limit the sale, dispensing, or transportation of firearms during a state of disaster emergency.

2	SECTION 1. 24-32-2104 (7) (h), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
3	amended to read:
4	24-32-2104. The governor and disaster emergencies. (7) In
5	addition to any other powers conferred upon the governor by law, the
6	governor may:
7	(h) Suspend or limit the sale, dispensing, or transportation of
8	alcoholic beverages, firearms, explosives, or combustibles; and
9	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
10	shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
11	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
12	11, 2010, if adjournment sine die is on May 12, 2010); except that, if a
13	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
14	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
15	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part shall not take effect
16	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
17	November 2010 and shall take effect on the date of the official
18	declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
