Bill Summary

The bill eliminates the authority of the governor to suspend or limit the sale, dispensing, or transportation of firearms during a state of disaster emergency.

2	SECTION 1. 24-32-2104 (7) (h), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
3	amended to read:
4	24-32-2104. The governor and disaster emergencies. (7) In
5	addition to any other powers conferred upon the governor by law, the
6	governor may:
7	(h) Suspend or limit the sale, dispensing, or transportation of
8	alcoholic beverages, firearms, explosives, or combustibles; and
9	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
10	shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
11	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly
12	(August 10, 2011, if adjournment sine die is on May 11, 2011); except
13	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article
14	V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of
15	this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part shall not
16	take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be
17	held in November 2012 and shall take effect on the date of the official
18	declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
