A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING AN EXTENSION OF THE REPEAL OF THE STATE SUBSTANCE
102 ABUSE TREND AND RESPONSE TASK FORCE, AND, IN CONNECTION
103 THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The state substance abuse trend and response task force is scheduled to be repealed effective July 1, 2018. The bill extends the repeal for 10 years to September 1, 2028.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-18.5-103, **amend**
3 (6)(a) and (6)(d) introductory portion as follows:

4 **18-18.5-103. State substance abuse trend and response task**
5 **force - creation - membership - duties.** (6) In addition, the task force
6 shall:

7 (a) Meet at least four times each year from the date of the first
8 meeting until January 1, 2018, or more often as directed by the chair of
9 the task force;

10 (d) NOTWITHSTANDING SECTION 24-1-136 (11)(a)(I), submit a
11 written report to the judiciary committees, or any successor committees,
12 of the senate and the house of representatives of the general assembly by
13 January 1, 2014, and by each January 1 thereafter, ~~through January 1,~~
14 ~~2018,~~ at a minimum specifying the following:

15 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-18.5-105, amend
16 (1)(a) as follows:

17 **18-18.5-105. Cash fund - created.** (1) (a) All private and public
18 funds received by the task force or the division of criminal justice in the
19 department of public safety, on behalf of the task force, through grants,
20 contributions, and donations pursuant to this article ARTICLE 18.5 shall be
21 transmitted to the state treasurer, who shall credit the same to the
22 substance abuse prevention, intervention, and treatment cash fund, which
23 fund is hereby created and referred to in this section as the "fund". The
24 moneys MONEY in the fund shall be subject to annual appropriation by the
25 general assembly for the direct and indirect costs associated with the
26 implementation of this article ARTICLE 18.5. All moneys MONEY in the
27 fund not expended for the purpose of this article ARTICLE 18.5 may be

1 invested by the state treasurer as provided by law. All interest and income
2 derived from the investment and deposit of moneys MONEY in the fund
3 shall be credited to the fund. Any unexpended and unencumbered moneys
4 MONEY remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall remain in
5 the fund and shall not be credited or transferred to the general fund or
6 another fund. All unexpended and unencumbered moneys MONEY
7 remaining in the fund as of July 1, 2018 SEPTEMBER 1, 2028, shall be
8 transferred to the general fund.

9 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **amend** 18-18.5-106
10 as follows:

11 **18-18.5-106. Repeal of article.** This ~~article~~ ARTICLE 18.5 is
12 repealed, effective ~~July 1, 2018~~ SEPTEMBER 1, 2028.

13 **SECTION 4. Appropriation.** For the 2018-19 state fiscal year,
14 \$3,000 is appropriated to the department of public safety for use by the
15 division of criminal justice. This appropriation is from the substance
16 abuse prevention, intervention, and treatment cash fund created in section
17 18-18.5-105 (1)(a), C.R.S. To implement this act, the department may use
18 this appropriation for the substance abuse trend and response task force.

19 **SECTION 5. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
20 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
21 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
