(8) In addition to any other 6 appropriation, there is hereby appropriated to the governor - lieutenant 7 governor - state planning and budgeting, for the fiscal year beginning July 8 1, 2012, the sum of $\frac{12,279,762}{20,322,440}$, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for allocation to the office of information technology for 9 10 Colorado benefits management system modernization contract expenses 11 related to the implementation of this act. Said sum shall be from 12 reappropriated funds received from the department of human services out 13 of the appropriation made in subsection (6) of this section. ANY FUNDS 14 APPROPRIATED IN THIS SUBSECTION (2) NOT EXPENDED PRIOR TO JULY 1, 15 2013, ARE FURTHER APPROPRIATED TO THE DEPARTMENT IN FY 2013-14 16 FOR THE SAME PURPOSES.
