Of said sum, \$3,307,395 13 \$2,441,089 is from the general fund, \$8,039 \$50,214 is from the old age 14 pension fund pursuant to section 7 (c) of article XXIV of the state 15 constitution,  $\frac{$2,669}{17,693}$  is from the children's basic health plan trust 16 created in section 25.5-8-105 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, \$1,150,000 17 IS FROM REAPPROPRIATED FUNDS RECEIVED FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF 18 HUMAN SERVICES OUT OF THE APPROPRIATION MADE IN SUBSECTION (6) OF 19 THIS SECTION, and \$4,312,733 \$14,345,249 is from federal funds. ANY 20 FUNDS APPROPRIATED IN THIS SUBSECTION (2) NOT EXPENDED PRIOR TO 21 JULY 1, 2013, ARE FURTHER APPROPRIATED TO THE DEPARTMENT IN FY 22 2013-14 FOR THE SAME PURPOSES.

SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
