101	CONCERNING REQUIRING LOCAL EDUCATION PROVIDERS TO MAINTAIN
102	ON-LINE PUBLIC ACCESS TO FINANCIAL DATA, AND, IN
103	CONNECTION THEREWITH, ENACTING THE "PUBLIC SCHOOL
104	FINANCIAL TRANSPARENCY ACT".

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill enacts the "Public School Financial Transparency Act" (act), which requires each school district, district charter school, board of

cooperative services, and institute charter school and the state charter school institute (local education provider) no later than September 1, 2011, to develop, maintain, and make publicly available a single, searchable, on-line, revenue and expenditure database (on-line database) that will allow a user to review at no cost information concerning moneys collected and expended by the local education provider.

The act sets forth the specific information that each on-line database will include. The local education provider must provide the data in an open, structured data format that allows the user to download and systematically sort, search, and access all of the data.

Each local education provider will update the data at least monthly, archive the data, make the data easily accessible from the local education provider's web site, and create a link to a service that allows users to be notified of updates to the on-line database.

10	(6) THE LOCAL EDUCATION PROVIDER SHALL:
11	(a) UPDATE THE DATA CONTAINED IN THE ON-LINE DATABASE AT
12	LEAST MONTHLY;
13	(b) ARCHIVE THE DATA IN THE ON-LINE DATABASE IN A MANNER
14	THAT ALLOWS THE DATA TO REMAIN ACCESSIBLE TO THE PUBLIC AND
15	DOWNLOADABLE AND SEARCHABLE BY A USER PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION
16	(4) OF THIS SECTION.
17	(c) Make the on-line database easily accessible from the
18	MAIN PAGE OF THE LOCAL EDUCATION PROVIDER'S WEB SITE; AND
19	(d) CREATE AND MAKE EASILY ACCESSIBLE AN AUTOMATED RICH
20	SITE SUMMARY FEED TO WHICH USERS OF THE ON-LINE DATABASE MAY
21	SUBSCRIBE FOR NOTIFICATION OF UPDATES TO THE ON-LINE DATABASE.
22	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
23	shall take effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
24	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
25	11, 2010, if adjournment sine die is on May 12, 2010); except that, if a
26	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
27	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act

- 2 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
- 3 November 2010 and shall take effect on the date of the official
- 4 declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
