11          to the implementation of this act. Of said sum, ~~\$2,950,265~~ \$2,609,238 is  
12          from the general fund, ~~\$182,116~~ \$1,923,081 is from the old age pension  
13          fund created in section 1 of article XXIV of the state constitution,  
14          ~~\$7,894,467~~ \$16,117,876 is from reappropriated funds received from the  
15          department of health care policy and financing out of the appropriation  
16          made in subsection (2) of this section, and ~~\$1,252,914~~ \$822,245 is from  
17          federal funds from the U.S. department of agriculture for the  
18          supplemental nutrition assistance program. ANY FUNDS APPROPRIATED IN  
19          THIS SUBSECTION (6) NOT EXPENDED PRIOR TO JULY 1, 2013, ARE FURTHER  
20          APPROPRIATED TO THE DEPARTMENT IN FY 2013-14 FOR THE SAME  
21          PURPOSES.

22          **SECTION 4. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,  
23          determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate  
24          preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
