(1) For the 2017-18 state fiscal year, \$26,943,875 is appropriated to the department of health care policy and financing and is for the payment of overexpenditures of line item appropriations contained in Part V of section 2 of chapter 421 (SB 17-254), Session Laws of Colorado 2017, as follows:
