Bill Summary

Sunset Process - Senate Agriculture, Natural Resources, and Energy Committee. The bill implements the recommendations of the





sunset review and report on the regulation of pesticide applicators by the department of agriculture by:

- Extending the repeal date of the regulatory program until September 1, 2024 (sections 1 and 2 of the bill);
- ! Adding a representative of the agricultural sector affected by the federal pesticide worker protection standard and a representative of organic farmers to the pesticide advisory committee (section 3);
- ! Reducing the period for which private applicators must maintain records from 3 years to 2 years in keeping with applicable federal requirements (section 4); and
- ! Measuring the deadline for licensing applications by when the application is received rather than by when it is postmarked (sections 5 and 6).

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-104, repeal

3 (46) (i); and **add** (55) (j) as follows:

24-34-104. General assembly review of regulatory agencies
and functions for termination, continuation, or reestablishment.
(46) The following agencies, functions, or both shall terminate on July
1, 2015:
(i) The regulation of commercial applicators, qualified

17 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 35-10-128 as

2 Repeal of article - termination of functions. 35-10-128. 3 Effective July 1, 2015 SEPTEMBER 1, 2024, this article is repealed. The 4 regulatory functions of the commissioner of agriculture shall also 5 terminate on July 1, 2015. Prior to such THE repeal, and termination, the 6 regulatory functions shall be reviewed THE DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY 7 AGENCIES SHALL REVIEW THE REGULATION BY THE COMMISSIONER OF THE 8 APPLICATION OF PESTICIDES PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE as provided for 9 in section 24-34-104, C.R.S., and as part of such review, the department 10 of regulatory agencies shall report on the extent of local regulation of 11 pesticides pursuant to section 31-15-707 (1) (b), C.R.S., or under the 12 police power of any political subdivision of the state. 13 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 35-10-125, amend 14 (1), (2) introductory portion, and (2) (h); and **add** (2) (j) and (2) (k) as 15 follows: 16 **35-10-125.** Advisory committee. (1) The state agricultural 17 commission created by section 35-1-105 shall appoint an advisory 18 committee of eleven THIRTEEN members to assist the commissioner in 19 promulgating rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of this 20 article. 21 The committee shall consist CONSISTS of the following (2)22 members:

4 SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 35-10-111 as
5 follows:

6 35-10-111. **Record-keeping requirements.** (1) Each 7 commercial, registered limited commercial, licensed private, and 8 registered public applicator shall keep and maintain records of each 9 pesticide application in the form and manner designated by the 10 commissioner. Such THE APPLICATOR SHALL RETAIN THE records shall be 11 retained for a period of three years after the date of the pesticide 12 application; and EXCEPT THAT THE RECORD RETENTION PERIOD FOR 13 PRIVATE APPLICATORS IS TWO YEARS.

(2) THE RECORDS shall be kept AS FOLLOWS:

(a) FOR A COMMERCIAL APPLICATOR, at the address specified in
 the application for the commercial applicator's business license; or, in the
 case of

(b) FOR A registered limited commercial and OR registered public
 applicators APPLICATOR, at the address specified in the registry authorized
 in section 35-10-109; or in the case of

21 (c) FOR A licensed private applicators, APPLICATOR, at the address
22 of record on file with the commissioner.

23 SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 35-10-107, amend
24 (2) and (3) as follows:

25 35-10-107. Commercial applicator business license - renewals.
26 (2) If the application for renewal is not postmarked RECEIVED on or
27 before the expiration date of the license, a penalty fee of ten percent of

the renewal fee shall be assessed and added to the renewal fee. No license
 shall be renewed until the total fee is paid.

3 (3) If the application and fee for renewal are not postmarked
4 RECEIVED on or before the thirtieth day following the expiration date of
5 the license, the business license shall not be renewed, and the commercial
6 applicator shall apply for a new license.

7 SECTION 6. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 35-10-116, amend
8 (5) as follows:

35-10-116. Qualified supervisor and certified operator licenses
- expiration - renewal of licenses - reinstatement. (5) If the application
and fee for renewal of any license issued pursuant to section 35-10-115
are not postmarked RECEIVED on or before the thirtieth day following the
expiration date of the license, the license shall not be renewed and the
licensee shall apply for a new license.

15 SECTION 7. Applicability. This act applies to conduct occurring
16 on or after July 1, 2015.

SECTION 8. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
