Bill Summary

The bill requires the state department of human services (department) to establish a veteran suicide prevention pilot program (pilot program) to reduce the suicide rate and suicidal ideation among veterans by providing no-cost, stigma-free, confidential, and effective behavioral health treatment for post-9/11 veterans and their families. SENATE 3rd Reading Unamended May 10, 2021

SENATE Amended 2nd Reading May 7, 2021 is permitted to enter into an agreement with a nonprofit organization to administer the pilot program. The department is required to include information about the pilot program in its annual report to the general assembly. The pilot program is repealed June 30, 2025.

17	(4) THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT RULES NECESSARY FOR
18	THE ADMINISTRATION OF THIS SECTION.
19	(5) THE STATE DEPARTMENT MAY ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT
20	WITH A NONPROFIT <u>OR EDUCATIONAL</u> ORGANIZATION TO ADMINISTER THE
21	PILOT PROGRAM. THE NONPROFIT <u>OR EDUCATIONAL</u> ORGANIZATION MUST

11	SECTION 2. Appropriation. For the 2021-22 state fiscal year,
12	\$1,681,600 General Fund is appropriated to the department of human
13	services for use by the office behavioral health. This appropriation is from
14	the general fund. To implement this act, the office may use this
15	appropriation for the veteran suicide prevention pilot program.
16	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
17	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
18	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
19	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
20	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
21	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
22	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
23	November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
24	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
