# A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING A PROHIBITION ON THE USE OF CERTAIN ANIMALS IN A
102 TRAVELING ANIMAL ACT.

**Bill Summary** 

The bill creates the "Traveling Animal Protection Act" (Act), which prohibits the use of certain animals in a traveling animal act. A person who violates the Act commits a misdemeanor and is subject to a fine ranging from \$250 to \$1,000 per violation.

12	OPERATOR FROM A PERFORMANCE, TO FINANCIALLY BENEFIT AS A PERSON
13	WHO OWNS OR CONTROLS A PROPERTY USED FOR A PERFORMANCE, OR TO
14	USE ANY MEANS OF COMMUNICATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROMOTING A
15	PERFORMANCE ON BEHALF OF THE OWNER OR OPERATOR OF A
16	PERFORMANCE OR THE VENUE FOR A PERFORMANCE.
17	(b) "ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION PROGRAM" MEANS AN ANIMAL
18	EXHIBITION THAT:
19	(I) IS DESIGNED BY A PROFESSIONAL TO IMPART KNOWLEDGE OR
20	INFORMATION FOR EDUCATIONAL OR CONSERVATION PURPOSES ABOUT
21	ONE OR MORE ANIMALS' NATURAL BEHAVIOR, HABITAT, LIFE CYCLE, OR
22	SIMILAR PEDAGOGICAL INFORMATION;
23	(II) IS CONDUCTED BY AN INDIVIDUAL QUALIFIED TO IMPART SUCH
24	INFORMATION; AND
25	(III) DOES NOT INCLUDE ANY PERFORMANCE OF BEHAVIOR BY AN
26	ANIMAL THAT DOES NOT NATURALLY OCCUR FOR THAT ANIMAL IN THE
27	WILD STATE, EXCEPT FOR INDUSTRY-STANDARD HUSBANDRY PRACTICES

2	(c) "Performance" means any animal act, circus, ride,
3	CARNIVAL, PARADE, RACE, PERFORMANCE, OR SIMILAR UNDERTAKING IN
4	WHICH ANIMALS ARE:
5	(I) REQUIRED TO PERFORM TRICKS, GIVE RIDES, OR PARTICIPATE AS
6	ACCOMPANIMENTS FOR THE ENTERTAINMENT, AMUSEMENT, OR BENEFIT
7	OF AN AUDIENCE; OR
8	(II) USED PRIMARILY FOR PHOTOGRAPHIC PURPOSES.
9	(d) "Traveling animal act" means any performance of an
10	ANIMAL WHERE THE ANIMAL IS TRANSPORTED TO, FROM, OR BETWEEN
11	LOCATIONS FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE PERFORMANCE.
12	(3) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION, A
13	PERSON SHALL NOT CAUSE A PERFORMANCE OF THE FOLLOWING ANIMALS,
14	INCLUDING HYBRIDS OF THE FOLLOWING ANIMALS, WHETHER WILD-BORNE
15	OR CAPTIVE-BRED, IN A TRAVELING ANIMAL ACT:
16	(a) CETARTIODACTYLA OTHER THAN BISON, CATTLE, DEER, ELK,
17	GOATS, REINDEER, SWINE, AND SHEEP;
18	(b) FELIDAE OTHER THAN DOMESTIC CATS;
19	(c) WILD CANIDAE OTHER THAN DOMESTIC DOGS;
20	(d) Marsupialia;
21	(e) Nonhuman primates;
22	(f) Perissodactyla other than horses, donkeys, and mules;
23	(g) Pinnipedia;
24	(h) Proboscidea;
25	(i) Ratites;
26	(j) Spheniscidae; and
27	(k) Ursidae.

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1	(4) This section does not prohibit the use of an animal
2	SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION:
3	(a) IN AN EXHIBITION AT A:
4	(I) WILDLIFE SANCTUARY;
5	(II) NONMOBILE, PERMANENT INSTITUTION, FACILITY, ZOO, OR
6	AQUARIUM ACCREDITED BY THE ASSOCIATION OF ZOOS AND AQUARIUMS
7	OR THE GLOBAL FEDERATION OF ANIMAL SANCTUARIES, OR ANY
8	SUCCESSOR ORGANIZATIONS; OR
9	(III) FACILITY WITH A ZOOLOGICAL PARK LICENSE ISSUED BY THE
10	DIVISION OR A CLASS C LICENSE ISSUED BY THE UNITED STATES
11	DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.
12	(b) If the animal is livestock, as defined in section
13	35-80-102 (9), OR ALTERNATIVE LIVESTOCK, AS DEFINED IN SECTION
14	35-41.5-102 (1);
15	(c) AS PART OF AN ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION PROGRAM IF:
16	(I) THE ANIMAL IS NOT USED MORE THAN SIX MONTHS IN A
17	CALENDAR YEAR; AND
18	(II) THE ANIMAL IS NOT KEPT IN A VEHICLE FOR MORE THAN
19	TWELVE HOURS PER DAY, WHEN THE VEHICLE IS USED TO TRANSPORT OR
20	HOUSE THE ANIMAL WHILE TRAVELING TO, FROM, OR BETWEEN LOCATIONS
21	FOR PERFORMANCE PURPOSES;
22	(d) BY A UNIVERSITY, COLLEGE, LABORATORY, OR OTHER
23	RESEARCH FACILITY PROPERLY LICENSED OR REGISTERED UNDER THE
24	FEDERAL "ANIMAL WELFARE ACT OF 1970", 7 U.S.C. SEC. 2131 ET SEQ.,
25	AS AMENDED, FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONDUCTING RESEARCH;
26	(e) FOR THE SOLE PURPOSE OF A FILM, AS DEFINED IN SECTION
27	24-48.5-114(1), or a television production, if the use in the film or

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1	TELEVISION PRODUCTION DOES NOT INVOLVE A LIVE ANIMAL EXHIBITION
2	OR PERFORMANCE CONDUCTED BEFORE AN AUDIENCE OR INTERACTION
3	WITH AN AUDIENCE, THE PUBLIC, CLIENTS, OR CUSTOMERS; OR
4	(f) AT A RODEO OR COUNTY FAIR.
5	(5) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A
6	MISDEMEANOR AND, UPON CONVICTION THEREOF, SHALL BE PUNISHED BY
7	A FINE OF NOT LESS THAN TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS AND NOT MORE
8	THAN ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS PER VIOLATION.
9	(6) This section does not prohibit working dog trials,
10	LIVESTOCK OR HORSE SHOWS, OR ANY OTHER EXHIBITION INVOLVING
11	<u>LIVESTOCK.</u>
12	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
13	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
14	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
15	that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
16	of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
17	act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
18	effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
19	November 2022 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
20	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
