SECTION 3. The appropriation to the department of higher education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, as enacted in Section 3 (2) of chapter 361, Session Laws of Colorado 2010 (HB 10-1383), is amended to read:

Section 3. **Appropriation - adjustments to the 2010 long bill.** (2) For the implementation of this act, the general fund appropriation made in the annual general appropriation act for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, for the department of higher education, Colorado commission on higher education FINANCIAL AID, FOR NEED-BASED GRANTS, shall be reduced by fifteen million four hundred thousand dollars (\$15,400,000).
