Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill requires the high-performance transportation enterprise to study the feasibility of entering into a public-private partnership to develop, construct, and operate a rail fixed guideway system between the Auraria higher education center and the Anschutz medical campus of the university of Colorado at Denver. If, after the study is completed, a special district is formed for the purpose of financing, developing, constructing, and operating such a system, the bill requires \$4 of each road safety surcharge paid by vehicle owners who reside within one mile of the system route to be paid to the special district.

5 (b) NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF SECTIONS 43-4-804(1)6 AND 43-4-205 (6.3), IF, AFTER THE TRANSPORTATION ENTERPRISE 7 COMPLETES THE FEASIBILITY STUDY REQUIRED BY PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS 8 SUBSECTION (11), A SPECIAL DISTRICT OR IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT OF ANY 9 KIND IS FORMED FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING, DEVELOPING, 10 CONSTRUCTING, AND OPERATING A RAIL FIXED GUIDEWAY SYSTEM 11 BETWEEN THE AURARIA HIGHER EDUCATION CENTER AND THE ANSCHUTZ 12 MEDICAL CAMPUS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF COLORADO AT DENVER, FOUR 13 DOLLARS FROM EACH ROAD SAFETY SURCHARGE IMPOSED PURSUANT TO 14 SECTION 43-4-804 (1) AND COLLECTED UPON THE REGISTRATION OF A 15 VEHICLE REGISTERED TO A PERSON AT AN ADDRESS THAT IS WITHIN ONE 16 MILE OF THE SYSTEM ROUTE SHALL BE ALLOCATED TO THE SPECIAL 17 DISTRICT OR IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT.
