**SECTION 4.** Appropriation to the department of human services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014. In Session Laws of Colorado 2014, amend section 2 of chapter 298, (HB 14-1338), as follows:

Section 2. **Appropriation.** In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the department of human services, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, the sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for allocation to the special purpose subdivision of the executive director's office for expenses related to the regional center task force and utilization study. OF THE MONEYS APPROPRIATED IN THIS SECTION, \$75,000 SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT UNTIL JUNE 30, 2016.

<b>SECTION 5. Safety clause.</b> The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
