- 61 Department of Natural Resources, Division of Reclamation, Mining, and Safety, Inactive Mines, Mine Site Reclamation -- This appropriation remains available until the completion of the project or the close of FY 2016-17, whichever comes first. At project completion or the end of the three-year period, any unexpended balance reverts to the Severance Tax Operational Fund, from which this appropriation was made.
- 62 Department of Natural Resources, Division of Reclamation, Mining, and Safety, Inactive Mines, Reclamation of Forfeited Mine Sites -- This appropriation remains available until the completion of the project or the close of FY 2016-17, whichever comes first. - 64 Department of Natural Resources, Oil and Gas Conservation Commission, Emergency Response -- It is the intent of the General Assembly that this appropriation be expended in the event that there is an oil and gas related emergency under the jurisdiction of the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission. The purpose of this funding is for investigation, prevention, monitoring, and mitigation of circumstances that are caused by or are alleged to be associated with oil and gas activities and that call for immediate action by the Oil and Gas Conservation Commission.
