# A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION OF THE RIVER OUTFITTER LICENSING

102 PROGRAM.

## **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Sunset Process - Senate Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee. The bill implements the recommendation of the department of regulatory agencies in its sunset review and report on the licensing of river outfitters by the division of parks and wildlife within the department of natural resources by continuing these functions until September 1, 2028.

The bill exempts the training of guides, trip leaders, and guide instructors from the authority of the private occupational schools division in the department of higher education.

The bill requires the parks and wildlife commission to promulgate rules to establish insurance requirements for vehicles used by river outfitters.

I	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-104, repeal
3	(17)(a)(IV); and <b>add</b> (29)(a)(V) as follows:
4	24-34-104. General assembly review of regulatory agencies
5	and functions for repeal, continuation, or reestablishment - legislative
6	<b>declaration - repeal.</b> (17)(a) The following agencies, functions, or both,
7	are scheduled for repeal on September 1, 2019:
8	(IV) The licensing of river outfitters through the parks and
9	wildlife commission and the division of parks and wildlife in accordance
10	with article 32 of title 33, C.R.S.;
11	(29) (a) The following agencies, functions, or both, are scheduled
12	for repeal on September 1, 2028:
13	(V) THE LICENSING OF RIVER OUTFITTERS THROUGH THE PARKS
14	AND WILDLIFE COMMISSION AND THE DIVISION OF PARKS AND WILDLIFE IN
15	ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 32 OF TITLE 33.
16	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 33-32-112 as
17	follows:
18	33-32-112. Repeal of article. This article ARTICLE 32 and the
19	licensing function of the division are repealed, effective September 1,
20	2019. Prior to such termination 2028. BEFORE THE REPEAL, the licensing
21	function shall be reviewed as provided for in IS SCHEDULED FOR REVIEW
22	IN ACCORDANCE WITH section 24-34-104. C.R.S.

1	SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-04-104, amend
2	(1) introductory portion and (1)(p); and add (1)(q) as follows:
3	23-64-104. Exemptions. (1) The following educational
4	institutions and educational services are exempt from the provisions of
5	this article 64:
6	(p) Yoga teacher training courses, programs, and schools; AND
7	(q) TRAINING OF GUIDES, TRIP LEADERS, AND GUIDE INSTRUCTORS

9	SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 33-32-103 as

14	(b) to Regulate river outfitters, guides, trip leaders, and guide
15	instructors;
16	(c) to Ensure the safety of associated river-running activities;
17	(d) to Establish guidelines to enable a river outfitter, guide, or trip
18	leader to make a determination that the condition of the river constitutes
19	a hazard to the life and safety of certain persons; and
20	(e) ESTABLISH INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR VEHICLES USED BY
21	RIVER OUTFITTERS; AND
22	(f) to Carry out the purposes of this article ARTICLE 32.
23	(2) The commission may promulgate rules specifically outlining
24	the procedures to be followed by the commission and by the enforcement
25	section of the division in the event of a death or serious injury during a
26	regulated trip.
27	(3) The commission shall e-mail a notice of every proposed rule

2	(4) The commission shall adopt rules regarding:
3	(a) Notification to outfitters of:
4	(I) Certain division personnel changes within ten days of AFTER
5	the change; and
6	(II) Safety training standards; and
7	(b) Customer and outfitter interaction training standards for
8	division rangers who monitor regulated trips.
9	SECTION 5. Act subject to petition - effective date -
10	applicability. (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following
11	the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the
12	general assembly (August 2, 2019, if adjournment sine die is on May 3,
13	2019); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1
14	(3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section,
15	or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part
16	will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election
17	to be held in November 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the
18	date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
19	(2) This act applies to conduct occurring on or after the applicable
20	effective date of this act.
