- Department of Human Services, Office of Information Technology Services, Colorado Benefits Management System, Ongoing Expenses, Operating and Contract Expenses -- Of this appropriation, \$13,449,352 remains available through June 30, 2018.
- Department of Human Services, County Administration, County Administration; and Adult Assistance Programs, Adult Protective Services, Adult Protective Services -- Any amount in the Adult Protective Services line item that is not required for the provision of adult protective services may be transferred to the County Administration line item and used to provide additional benefits under that program. Further, if county spending exceeds the total appropriations from the Adult Protective Services line item, any amount in the County Administration line item that is not required for the provision of services under that program may be transferred to the Adult Protective Services line item and used to provide adult protective services.
- Department of Human Services, County Administration, County Share of Offsetting Revenues -- It is the intent of the General Assembly that, pursuant to section 26-13-108, C.R.S., the Department utilize recoveries to offset the costs of providing public assistance. This appropriation represents an estimate of the county share of such recoveries, and, if the amount of the county share of such recoveries is greater than the amount reflected in this appropriation, the Department is authorized to disburse an amount in excess of this appropriation to reflect the actual county share of such recoveries.
- Department of Human Services, County Administration, County Incentive Payments; Office of Self Sufficiency, Colorado Works Program, County Block Grants; Child Support Enforcement, Child Support Enforcement -- Pursuant to Sections 26-13-108 and 26-13-112.5 (2), C.R.S., the Department shall distribute child support incentive payments to counties. Further, all of the State share of recoveries of amounts of support for public assistance recipients, less annual appropriations from this fund source for state child support enforcement operations, shall be distributed to counties, as described in Section 26-13-108, C.R.S. If the total amount of the State share of recoveries is greater than the total annual appropriations from this fund source, the Department is authorized to distribute to counties, for county incentive payments, the actual State share of any additional recoveries.
- Department of Human Services, Division of Child Welfare -- It is the intent of the General Assembly to encourage counties to serve children in the most appropriate and least restrictive manner. For this purpose, the Department may transfer funds among all line items in this long bill group total for the Division of Child Welfare, except that the Department may not transfer funds from non-custodial line items to the Child Welfare Administration line item to increase funding for personal services.
- Department of Human Services, Division of Child Welfare, Family and Children's Programs -- It is the intent of the General Assembly that \$4,006,949 of the funds appropriated for this line item be used to assist county departments of social services in implementing and expanding family- and community-based services for adolescents. It is the intent of the General Assembly that such services be based on a program or programs demonstrated to be effective in reducing the need for higher cost residential services.

- Department of Human Services, Office of Early Childhood, Division of Community and Family Support, Early Childhood Mental Health Services -- It is the intent of the General Assembly that this appropriation be used for the purpose of supporting early childhood mental health specialists in each community mental health center.
- Department of Human Services, Office of Self Sufficiency, Administration, Personal Services and Operating Expenses; and Special Purpose Welfare Programs, Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Administration -- The Department is authorized to transfer up to 5.0 percent of the total appropriations between these line items.
- Department of Human Services, Office of Self Sufficiency, Colorado Works Program, County Block Grants -- Pursuant to Sections 26-2-714 (7) and 26-2-714 (9), C.R.S., under certain conditions, a county may transfer federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funds within its Colorado Works Program Block Grant to the federal child care development fund or to programs funded by Title XX of the federal Social Security Act. One of the conditions specified is that the amount a county transfers must be specified by the Department of Human Services as being available for transfer within the limitation imposed by federal law. The Department may allow individual counties to transfer a greater percent of federal TANF funds than the state is allowed under federal law as long as: (a) Each county has had an opportunity to transfer an amount up to the federal maximum allowed; and, (b) the total amount transferred statewide does not exceed the federal maximum.
- Department of Human Services, Office of Self Sufficiency, Colorado Works Program, County Block Grants -- The appropriation of local funds for Colorado Works program county block grants may be decreased by a maximum of \$100,000 to reduce one or more small counties' fiscal year 2016-17 targeted or actual spending level pursuant to Section 26-2-714 (8), C.R.S.
- Department of Human Services, Office of Self Sufficiency, Colorado Works Program, County Block Grants -- It is the intent of the General Assembly that \$2,000,000 of the federal funds appropriation to this line item be allocated to counties for employment-focused programs.
- Department of Human Services, Office of Self Sufficiency, Colorado Works Program, County Block Grants -- The Department may comply with the provisions of Section 26-2-714 (10), C.R.S., by reducing required county Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) maintenance of effort expenditures in the fiscal year after the State is notified that it has met federal work participation rates and qualifies for a percent reduction in the state's maintenance of effort. If the State is notified during state FY 2015-16 that it has met federal work participation rates for a prior year and therefore qualifies for a percent reduction in the state's maintenance of effort, local cash funds expenditure obligations that are established in this line item pursuant to Section 26-2-714 (6) (c) (I), C.R.S., shall be reduced by \$5,524,726.
- Department of Human Services, Behavioral Health Services, Mental Health Community Programs, Services for Indigent Mentally Ill Clients -- It is the intent of the General Assembly that \$500,000 of this appropriation be allocated to a community mental health center in western Colorado for the purpose of covering the uncompensated costs of co-managing an observation unit PROVIDING BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES for individuals who seek care from the emergency

department of a regional medical center and who are diagnosed with physical health conditions that may be exacerbated by co-occurring mental health conditions.

- Department of Human Services, Behavioral Health Services, Integrated Behavioral Health Services, Rural Co-occurring Disorder Services -- It is the intent of the General Assembly that this appropriation be used for the purpose of providing a full continuum of co-occurring behavioral health treatment services in southern Colorado and the Arkansas Valley.
- Department of Human Services, Behavioral Health Services, Mental Health Institutes -- In addition to the transfer authority provided in Section 24-75-108, C.R.S., the Department is authorized to transfer up to 10.0 percent of the total appropriations in this subsection among line items in this subsection.
- Department of Human Services, Services for People with Disabilities, Regional Centers for People with Developmental Disabilities, Wheat Ridge Regional Center, Wheat Ridge Regional Center Intermediate Care Facility; and Grand Junction Regional Center, Grand Junction Regional Center Intermediate Care Facility -- In addition to the transfer authority provided in Section 24-75-108, C.R.S., the Department may transfer up to 5.0 percent of the total appropriation for Intermediate Care Facilities between the Wheat Ridge Regional Center and the Grand Junction Regional Center.
- Department of Human Services, Services for People with Disabilities, Regional Centers for People with Developmental Disabilities, Grand Junction Regional Center, Grand Junction Regional Center Waiver Services; and Pueblo Regional Center, Pueblo Regional Center Waiver Services -- In addition to the transfer authority provided in Section 24-75-108, C.R.S., the Department may transfer up to 5.0 percent of the total appropriation for Regional Center waiver services between the Grand Junction Regional Center and the Pueblo Regional Center.
- Department of Human Services, Adult Assistance Programs, Other Grant Programs, Home Care Allowance; and Home Care Allowance Grant Program -Pursuant to Section 26-2-122.4 (3), C.R.S, any amount in the Home Care Allowance Grant Program line item that is not required to operate the Grant Program
  may be transferred to the Home Care Allowance line item and used to provide additional benefits under that program. Further, any amount in the Home Care
  Allowance line item that is unused may be transferred to the Home Care Allowance Grant Program line item and used to provide additional benefits under
  that program.
- Department of Human Services, Adult Assistance Programs, Community Services for the Elderly, Older Americans Act Programs, and State Funding for Senior Services -- Amounts in the Older Americans Act Programs line item are calculated based on a requirement for a non-federal match of at least 15 percent, including a 5.0 percent state match, pursuant to Title III of the federal Older Americans Act. The Department is authorized to transfer General Fund and cash funds from the State Funding for Senior Services line item to the Older Americans Act Programs line item to comply with the 5.0 percent state match requirement for the Older Americans Act Programs. This appropriation is based on the assumption that all federal Title III funds requiring a state match that are not for purposes of administration or included in the appropriations for other line items will be expended from the Older Americans Act Programs line item.

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Department of Human Services, Adult Assistance Programs, Community Services for the Elderly, State Funding for Services -- It is the intent of the General Assembly that \$500,000 General Fund of this appropriation be used for the purpose of providing services for seniors who are blind or visually impaired and whose sight loss cannot be corrected with prescription lenses in order to assist them in maintaining their independence in their home.

**SECTION 2. Appropriation to the department of human** services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2016. In Session Laws of Colorado 2016, amend section 28 of chapter 153, (HB 16-1408), as follows:

- Section 28. **Appropriation adjustments to 2016 long bill.** (1) To implement this act, appropriations made in the annual general appropriation act for the 2016-17 state fiscal year to the department of human services are adjusted as follows:
- (a) The cash funds appropriation from the offender mental health services fund created in section 27-66-104 (4) (a), C.R.S., for mental health services for juvenile and adult offenders is decreased by \$3,025,192.
- (b) The cash funds appropriation from the tobacco litigation settlement cash fund created in section 24-22-115 (1) (a), C.R.S., for mental health treatment services for youth (H.B. 99-1116) is decreased by \$300,000.
- (c) The cash funds appropriation from the alcohol and drug abuse community prevention and treatment fund created in section 24-75-1104.5 (1.5) (a) (VIII) (A), C.R.S., for community prevention and treatment related to substance use treatment and prevention is decreased by \$756,298.
- (d) The Cash funds appropriation from the offender mental health services fund created in section 27-66-104 (4) (a), C.R.S., for personal services related to community behavioral health administration is decreased by \$95,333.
- (e) The Cash funds appropriation from the offender mental health services fund created in section 27-66-104 (4) (a), C.R.S., for operating expenses related to community behavioral health administration is decreased by \$4,482.
- (f) The Cash funds appropriation from the alcohol and drug abuse community prevention and treatment fund created in section 24-75-1104.5 (1.5) (a) (VIII) (A), C.R.S., for personal services related to community behavioral health administration is decreased by \$55,382.

- (g) The Cash funds appropriation from the alcohol and drug abuse community prevention and treatment fund created in section 24-75-1104.5 (1.5) (a) (VIII) (A), C.R.S., for operating expenses related to community behavioral health administration is decreased by \$11,538.
- (2) For the 2016-17 state fiscal year, \$4,081,490 is appropriated to the department of human services. This appropriation is from the marijuana tax cash fund created in section 39-28.8-501 (1), C.R.S. To implement this act, the division DEPARTMENT may use this appropriation as follows:
- (a) \$3,025,192 \$2,900,185 for mental health services for juvenile and adult offenders;
- (b) \$300,000 for mental health treatment services for youth (H.B. 99-1116); and
- (c) \$756,298 for community prevention and treatment related to the substance use treatment and prevention. PREVENTION;
- (d) \$150,715 for Personal Services related to community behavioral health administration; and
- (e) \$16,020 FOR OPERATING EXPENSES RELATED TO COMMUNITY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH ADMINISTRATION.
- **SECTION 3.** Appropriation to the department of human services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014. In Session Laws of Colorado 2014, amend section 10 (1)(c) of chapter 259, (HB 14-1317), as section 10 (1)(c) is amended by section 21 of chapter 364, (SB15-234), Session Laws of Colorado 2015, and as section 10 (1)(c) is amended by section 13 of chapter 385, (HB16-1405), Session Laws of Colorado 2016, as follows:
- Section 10. **Appropriation.** (1) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated to the department of human services, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, the sum of \$9,922,744, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be allocated for the implementation of this act as follows:

(c) \$1,216,781 federal funds for modifications to the child care automated tracking system. Of these funds, \$455,000 shall remain available until June 30, 2017.

**SECTION 4. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
