Bill Summary

The bill requires the Colorado department of labor and employment (department) to create the Colorado state apprenticeship resource directory. The department is required to collect detailed information on each apprenticeship program in the state, including the application process, requirements for enrollment, costs, and program

SENATE Amended 2nd Reading April 16, 2019 outcomes. The department is required to promote the availability of the directory.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 8-83-308 as 3 follows: 4 8-83-308. Colorado state apprenticeship resource directory -5 collection of apprenticeship program information - promotion of 6 public awareness. (1) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2020, THE 7 DEPARTMENT SHALL CREATE THE COLORADO STATE APPRENTICESHIP 8 RESOURCE DIRECTORY, REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS THE 9 "DIRECTORY". THE DIRECTORY MUST INCLUDE, FOR EACH APPRENTICESHIP 10 PROGRAM LISTED IN THE DIRECTORY, THE INFORMATION COLLECTED BY 11 THE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (1). - (c) IDENTIFYING AND INFORMING THE APPROPRIATE CONTACT PERSONS AT COLORADO EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS OF THE AVAILABILITY OF THE DIRECTORY. THE EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS INCLUDE HIGH SCHOOL GUIDANCE OFFICES, COMMUNITY COLLEGES, STATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES, AND PRIVATE HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS.
- (d) Informing relevant private industry and business associations of the availability of the directory and requesting that the associations promote the directory to association members.
 - <u>\$25,507</u> is appropriated to the department of labor and employment for use by the division of employment and training. This appropriation is from the general fund and is based on an assumption that the division will require an additional 0.4 FTE. To implement this act, the division may use this appropriation for state operations and program costs.

SECTION <u>3.</u> Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 2, 2019, if adjournment sine die is on May 3, 2019); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
