A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 101CONCERNING THE ALLOCATION OF MONEY BY THE COLORADO102COMMISSION ON HIGHER EDUCATION FOR TUITION ASSISTANCE
- 103 FOR MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL GUARD.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Joint Budget Committee. Under current law, the Colorado commission on higher education (commission) is prohibited from allocating more than \$800,000 annually for purposes of providing tuition assistance to members of the National Guard. The bill removes statutory provisions relating to the limit on appropriations and the commission's

allocation of money for the tuition assistance program.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 23-3.3-202
 as follows:

23-3.3-202. Program funding. (1) Out of any moneys MONEY
provided for the financial assistance program authorized by section
23-3.3-102, the commission shall first provide tuition assistance to
individuals who qualify under the provisions of this part 2. or section
23-5-111.4, consistent with the provisions of subsection (2) of this
section.

10 (2) The commission shall not allocate more than eight hundred
 11 thousand dollars under subsection (1) of this section for purposes of
 12 providing tuition assistance to members of the National Guard pursuant
 13 to section 23-5-111.4.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-5-111.4, amend
(3)(a) and (9)(a) as follows:

16 23-5-111.4. Tuition for members of the National Guard -17 definitions. (3) (a) For the purposes of this section, "designated 18 institution of higher education" means the Colorado state university -19 Pueblo, Adams state university, Colorado Mesa university, Metropolitan 20 state university of Denver, Fort Lewis college, Western state Colorado 21 university, all independent area technical colleges, all local district 22 colleges, the university of northern Colorado, the university of Colorado 23 at Boulder, the university of Colorado at Denver, the university of 24 Colorado at Colorado Springs, Colorado state university, the Colorado 25 school of mines, the university of Colorado health sciences center, all

1 community colleges governed by the state board for community colleges 2 and occupational education, and any private institution of higher 3 education in Colorado that qualifies for the college opportunity fund 4 pursuant to article 18 of this title TITLE 23 and that offers an accredited 5 certificate or degree program in homeland security. For a member of the 6 Colorado National Guard enrolled in a private institution of higher 7 education, tuition assistance is limited to the completion of the accredited 8 certificate or degree program in homeland security and is provided at the 9 discretion of the adjutant general of the department of military and 10 veterans affairs. The tuition benefit to members of the Colorado National 11 Guard under this subsection (3) for an accredited certificate or degree 12 program in homeland security shall not exceed the moneys appropriated 13 annually to the Colorado National Guard pursuant to section 23-3.3-202.

14 (9) (a) There is hereby created in the state treasury the Colorado 15 National Guard tuition fund which shall be IS administered by the 16 department of military and veterans affairs and which shall consist 17 CONSISTS of all moneys which MONEY THAT may be appropriated thereto 18 by the general assembly or which may be THAT IS otherwise made 19 available to it by the general assembly. Moneys MONEY "otherwise made 20 available" shall include INCLUDES any repayment of tuition assistance 21 made pursuant to subsection (6) of this section. and any moneys 22 appropriated by the general assembly for purposes of this section in 23 accordance with section 23-3.3-202. The moneys MONEY in the fund are 24 hereby IS continuously appropriated for the payment of tuition assistance 25 as provided in this section. Any moneys MONEY not expended at the end 26 of the fiscal year shall remain REMAINS in the fund and shall not be 27 transferred to or revert to the general fund of the state.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
