Bill Summary

Current law provides both a criminal penalty and a civil fine for discrimination in places of public accommodation. The bill repeals the criminal provisions.

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-602, amend
 (3); and repeal (2) as follows:

24-34-602. Penalty and civil liability. (2) For each violation of
section 24-34-601, the person is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon
conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars
nor more than three hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the county jail
for not more than one year, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

9 (3) A judgment in favor of the party aggrieved or punishment 10 upon an indictment or information shall be a bar to either prosecution, 11 respectively; but The relief provided by this section shall be IS an 12 alternative to that authorized by section 24-34-306 (9), and a person who 13 seeks redress under this section shall IS not be permitted to seek relief 14 from the commission.

15 SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
16 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
17 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
