A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING MODIFICATIONS TO LAWS REGULATING TICKET SALES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

With regard to event ticket sales and resales, the bill repeals provisions prohibiting certain restrictions on ticket resales and instead limits a reseller from advertising, offering for sale, or contracting to resell tickets or accepting payment for a resale ticket unless the reseller has possession of the ticket or has a written contract to obtain the ticket from the person who possesses it and the ticket matches the advertised description of the ticket. The bill also specifies that terms or conditions on the original sale of a ticket, including limits on transferability, are

permissible.

With regard to online ticket sales, the bill adds the following as deceptive trade practices:

- Using or causing to be used a website to display a trademarked or copyrighted URL, title, image, or other symbol without written consent; or
- Using or causing to be used a website to display text, images, web designs, or internet addresses, which website is substantially similar to another website, without written consent.
- 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
- 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 6-1-718, amend
- (1)(a), (1)(d), (1)(e), (1)(f), (2), (3), and (5); and repeal (4) as follows:
- 4 6-1-718. Ticket sales and resales prohibitions unlawful
- 5 **conditions definitions.** (1) As used in this section, unless the context
- 6 otherwise requires:
- 7 (a) (I) "Operator" means a person or entity who THAT:
- 8 (A) Owns, operates, or controls a place of entertainment or who
- 9 promotes or produces entertainment; and that
- 10 (B) Sells a ticket to an event for original sale. including
- 11 (II) "OPERATOR" INCLUDES:
- 12 (A) A PERSON THAT HAS BEEN AUTHORIZED BY A PERSON
- DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (1)(a)(I)(A) OF THIS SECTION TO SELL A TICKET
- 14 TO AN EVENT FOR ORIGINAL SALE; AND
- 15 (B) An employee of such A person or entity DESCRIBED IN
- 16 SUBSECTION (1)(a)(I) OF THIS SECTION.
- 17 (d) "Purchaser" means a person or entity who THAT purchases a
- ticket to a place of entertainment.
- (e) "Resale" or "resold" means a sale other than the original sale
- of a ticket by a person. or entity.

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(f) "Reseller" means a person or entity that offers or sells RESALE
tickets for resale after the original sale by the operator OR THAT OPERATES
A PLATFORM OR EXCHANGE FOR ADVERTISING, LISTING, OR SELLING
RESALE TICKETS, including an entity A PERSON that operates a platform or
exchange for the purchase and sale of ORIGINAL SALE tickets to events
that also engages in the purchase and resale of the ticket TICKETS either
on behalf of the operator or on its own behalf if a reseller.
(2) Resellers shall guarantee a full refund to a purchaser OF A
TICKET if:
(a) The event for which the ticket was resold is canceled;
(b) The ticket does not or would not in fact grant the purchaser
admission; to the event for which the ticket was resold;
(c) The ticket is counterfeit; or
(d) The ticket fails to conform to its description as advertised or
as represented to the purchaser by the reseller.
(3) (a) It is void as against public policy to apply a term or
condition to the original sale to the purchaser to limit the terms or
conditions of resale, including, but not limited to, a term or condition:
(I) That restricts resale in a subscription or season ticket package
agreement as a condition of purchase;
(II) That a purchaser must comply with to retain a ticket for the
duration of a subscription or season ticket package agreement that limits
the rights of the purchaser to resell the ticket;
(III) That a purchaser must comply with to retain any contractually
agreed-upon rights to purchase future subscriptions or season ticket
package agreements; or
(IV) That imposes a sanction on the purchaser if the sale of the

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1	ticket is not through a reseller approved by the operator.
2	(b) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to prohibit an operator
3	from prohibiting the resale of a contractual right in a season ticket
4	package agreement that gives the original purchaser a priority or other
5	preference to enter into a subsequent season ticket package agreement
6	with the operator. A RESELLER SHALL NOT ADVERTISE, OFFER FOR SALE,
7	OR CONTRACT FOR THE RESALE OF A TICKET OR ACCEPT FULL OR PARTIAL
8	CONSIDERATION FOR RESALE OF A TICKET UNLESS THE TICKET CONFORMS
9	TO ITS DESCRIPTION AS ADVERTISED AND:
10	(a) THE RESELLER HAS POSSESSION OF THE TICKET; OR
11	(b) The reseller has a written contract to obtain the
12	TICKET AT A CERTAIN PRICE FROM A PERSON THAT HAS:
13	(I) Possession of the ticket; or
14	(II) A CONTRACTUAL RIGHT TO OBTAIN THE TICKET FROM A
15	PERSON THAT HAS POSSESSION OF THE TICKET.
16	(4) A person or entity, including an operator, that regulates
17	admission to an event shall not deny access to the event to a person in
18	possession of a valid ticket to the event, regardless of whether the ticket
19	is subject to a subscription or season ticket package agreement, based
20	solely on the ground that such ticket was resold through a reseller that
21	was not approved by the operator.
22	(5) (a) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit
23	PROHIBITS:
24	(I) APPLICATION OF A TERM OR CONDITION TO THE ORIGINAL SALE
25	OF A TICKET, INCLUDING A TERM OR CONDITION RESTRICTING OR
26	PROHIBITING THE TRANSFER OF A TICKET; OR

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An operator from maintaining and enforcing policies

1	regarding conduct or behavior at or in connection with the operator's
2	venue.
3	(b) An operator may CANCEL, revoke, or restrict season tickets for
4	reasons relating to a violation of venue policies and to the extent the
5	operator may deem DEEMS necessary for the protection of the safety of
6	patrons or to address fraud or misconduct.
7	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 6-1-720, amend (1);
8	repeal (3); and add (2)(c) and (2)(d) as follows:
9	6-1-720. Online event ticket sales - deceptive trade practice -
10	definitions. (1) A person engages in a deceptive trade practice when, in
11	the course of the person's business, vocation, or occupation, such THE
12	person:
13	(a) Uses or causes to be used a software application that runs
14	automated tasks over the internet to access a computer, computer
15	network, or computer system, or any part thereof OF A COMPUTER,
16	COMPUTER NETWORK, OR COMPUTER SYSTEM for the purpose of
17	purchasing tickets in excess of authorized limits for an online event ticket
18	sale with the intent to resell such THE tickets; or
19	(b) Uses or causes to be used a software application that runs
20	automated tasks over the internet AND that circumvents or disables any
21	electronic queues, waiting periods, or other sales volume limitation
22	systems associated with an online event ticket sale;
23	(c) Uses or causes to be used an internet website to
24	DISPLAY A TRADEMARKED OR COPYRIGHTED URL, TITLE, DESIGNATION,
25	IMAGE, MARK, OR OTHER SYMBOL WITHOUT THE WRITTEN CONSENT OF THE
26	TRADEMARK OR COPYRIGHT HOLDER; OR
27	(d) Uses or causes to be used an internet website to

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I	DISPLAY ANY COMBINATION OF TEXT, IMAGES, WEB DESIGNS, OR INTERNET
2	ADDRESSES, WHICH INTERNET WEBSITE IS SUBSTANTIALLY SIMILAR TO THE
3	INTERNET WEBSITE OF AN OPERATOR, WITHOUT THE WRITTEN CONSENT OF
4	THE OPERATOR.
5	(2) As used in this section, unless the context otherwise requires:
6	(c) "OPERATOR" HAS THE SAME MEANING AS SET FORTH IN
7	SECTION 6-1-718 (1)(a).
8	(d) "URL" MEANS THE UNIFORM RESOURCE LOCATOR ASSOCIATED
9	WITH AN INTERNET WEBSITE.
10	(3) This section shall not prohibit the resale of tickets in a
11	secondary market by a person other than the event sponsor or promoter.
12	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date -
13	applicability. (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following
14	the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the
15	general assembly; except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant
16	to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an
17	item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item,
18	section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the
19	general election to be held in November 2022 and, in such case, will take
20	effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the
21	governor.
22	(2) This act applies to conduct occurring on or after the applicable
23	effective date of this act.

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
