101 CONCERNING THE PROVISION OF LEGAL SERVICES FOR THE
102 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION IN THE 2016-17 STATE FISCAL
103 YEAR.

Bill Summary

For the 2016-17 state fiscal year, the bill increases the amount of reappropriated funds that are appropriated to the department of law for the purpose of providing additional legal services for the department of education.
