## A BILL FOR AN ACT <br> CONCERNING AUTHORIZATION OF FUNDING FOR EDUCATIONAL

## Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries.)

The bill authorizes the read-to-achieve board to award up to \$1,000,000 per year to organizations that operate promise neighborhoods or choice neighborhoods, as described in federal law, to fund programs that pay incentives to students to read books. The organization must be operating the reading program with a public school or a public library.

To be eligible to apply, an organization must provide proof that it is approved for federal funding. The reading incentive grant program must be available to students enrolled in any of grades one through 5 in a public school within the boundaries of the promise or choice neighborhood. To receive the incentive, the student must read the book outside of class time and successfully complete a quiz on the book.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
SECTION 1. Part 9 of article 7 of title 22, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION to read:

22-7-905.5. Promise neighborhoods - reading incentive program grants. (1) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF THIS PART 9 TO THE CONTRARY, THE READ-TO-ACHIEVE BOARD MAY ANNUALLY AWARD UP TO ONE MILLION DOLLARS IN GRANTS TO ORGANIZATIONS THAT OPERATE PROMISE NEIGHBORHOODS OR CHOICE NEIGHBORHOODS, AS DESCRIBED IN FEDERAL LAW, TO FUND PROGRAMS THAT PROVIDE INCENTIVES TO READ BOOKS FOR STUDENTS ENROLLED IN GRADES ONE through five. The read-To-Achieve board shall award grants PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION FOR A SINGLE ACADEMIC YEAR BUT MAY RENEW THE GRANTS FOR ADDITIONAL YEARS. THE READ-TO-ACHIEVE BOARD SHALL INCLUDE ANY GRANTS AWARDED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION IN THE LIST OF GRANT RECIPIENTS SUBMITTED TO THE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO SECTION 22-7-905 (4).
(2) IN SELECTING GRANT RECIPIENTS PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION, THE READ-TO-ACHIEVE BOARD SHALL NOT APPLY THE CRITERIA SPECIFIED IN SECTION 22-7-905 (3) OR ANY CRITERIA SPECIFIED IN STATE BOARD RULE BUT SHALL AWARD A GRANT TO AN ORGANIZATION UNDER THIS SECTION IF THE PROPOSED READING INCENTIVE PROGRAM:
(a) Applies to students enrolled in any of grades one THROUGH FIVE;
(b) OPERATES IN COORDINATION WITH ONE OR MORE PUBLIC SCHOOLS OR PUBLIC LIBRARIES LOCATED WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE PROMISE OR CHOICE NEIGHBORHOOD THAT IS OVERSEEN BY THE APPLYING ORGANIZATION; AND
(c) AWARDS A MONETARY INCENTIVE TO A STUDENT WHEN THE STUDENT READS A BOOK OUTSIDE OF REGULAR CLASS TIME AND SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETES A QUIZ TO PROVE HE OR SHE READ THE BOOK.
(3) AN ORGANIZATION MAY APPLY FOR A READING INCENTIVE PROGRAM GRANT PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION ONLY IF IT HAS BEEN APPROVED FOR FEDERAL FUNDING IN THE FORM OF A PROMISE NEIGHBORHOOD PLANNING GRANT OR THROUGH THE FEDERAL CHOICE NEIGHBORHOODS PROGRAM. AN ORGANIZATION THAT APPLIES FOR A READING INCENTIVE PROGRAM GRANT PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION SHALL SUBMIT AN APPLICATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TIMELINES SPECIFIED BY RULE OF THE STATE BOARD PURSUANT TO SECTION 22-7-906 (1) (b). The application shall consist of:
(a) A DESCRIPTION OF THE READING INCENTIVE PROGRAM FOR WHICH THE APPLICANT IS REQUESTING A GRANT, INCLUDING THE PUBLIC SCHOOL OR LIBRARY THE ORGANIZATION IS WORKING WITH, THE POTENTIAL NUMBER OF PARTICIPATING STUDENTS, AND THE MANNER IN WHICH A STUDENT MUST DEMONSTRATE COMPREHENSION OF A BOOK IN ORDER TO RECEIVE THE INCENTIVE;
(b) The AMOUNT REQUESTED; AND
(c) Proof that the applicant has been approved for federal FUNDING IN THE FORM OF A PROMISE NEIGHBORHOOD PLANNING GRANT OR

THROUGH THE FEDERAL CHOICE NEIGHBORHOODS PROGRAM.
(4) An organization shall apply any moneys received pursuant to this section to providing incentives to students THROUGH THE READING INCENTIVE PROGRAM THAT MEETS THE CRITERIA SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION. An Organization that RECEIVES A GRANT PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION SHALL NOT BE SUBJECT TO the requirements specified for grant recipients in section 22-7-905 OR BY RULE OF THE STATE BOARD.
(5) Anorganizationthatreceives a grant pursuant tothis SECTION SHALL ANNUALLY REPORT TO THE READ-TO-ACHIEVE BOARD THE number of books read and the amount earned per student. The READ-TO-ACHIEVE BOARD SHALL INCLUDE THE INFORMATION RECEIVED PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (5) IN THE ANNUAL REPORT PREPARED pURSUANT TO SECTION 22-7-907.

SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
