A BILL FOR AN ACT

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill directs the general assembly to appropriate \$10 million for the 2018-19 budget year to the department of education to distribute to small rural districts and institute charter schools that are located within small rural districts. The money is distributed on a per pupil basis based on the student enrollment or funded pupil count for the 2017-18 budget year. If the rural district is the authorizer for a district charter school, the rural district must distribute the full per pupil share of the amount received to the district charter school.

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Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 22-54-140 as 3 follows: 4 22-54-140. Additional funding - small rural districts - eligible 5 charter schools - definitions - repeal. (1) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, 6 UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES: 7 (a) "ELIGIBLE INSTITUTE CHARTER SCHOOL" MEANS AN INSTITUTE 8 CHARTER SCHOOL THAT HAS A SMALL RURAL DISTRICT AS ITS ACCOUNTING 9 DISTRICT. 10 (b) "PER PUPIL DISTRIBUTION AMOUNT" MEANS AN AMOUNT EQUAL 11 TO TEN MILLION DOLLARS DIVIDED BY THE SUM OF THE TOTAL FUNDED 12 PUPIL COUNT FOR THE 2017-18 BUDGET YEAR OF ALL SMALL RURAL 13 DISTRICTS AND THE TOTAL STUDENT ENROLLMENT FOR THE 2017-18 14 BUDGET YEAR OF ALL ELIGIBLE INSTITUTE CHARTER SCHOOLS. (c) "SMALL RURAL DISTRICT" MEANS A DISTRICT IN COLORADO 15 16 THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION DETERMINES IS RURAL, BASED ON 17 THE GEOGRAPHIC SIZE OF THE DISTRICT AND THE DISTANCE OF THE 18 DISTRICT FROM THE NEAREST LARGE, URBANIZED AREA, AND THAT 19 ENROLLS FEWER THAN ONE THOUSAND STUDENTS IN KINDERGARTEN 20 THROUGH TWELFTH GRADE. 21 (2) FOR THE 2018-19 BUDGET YEAR, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY 22 SHALL APPROPRIATE TEN MILLION DOLLARS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF 23 EDUCATION TO DISTRIBUTE TO SMALL RURAL DISTRICTS AND TO ELIGIBLE 24 INSTITUTE CHARTER SCHOOLS AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION. A SMALL 25 RURAL DISTRICT AND AN ELIGIBLE INSTITUTE CHARTER SCHOOL THAT

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RECEIVE MONEY PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION MAY USE THE MONEY ONLY
 FOR NONRECURRING EXPENSES.

3 (3) (a) THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL DISTRIBUTE TO
4 EACH SMALL RURAL DISTRICT AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE PER PUPIL
5 DISTRIBUTION AMOUNT MULTIPLIED BY THE SMALL RURAL DISTRICT'S
6 FUNDED PUPIL COUNT FOR THE 2017-18 BUDGET YEAR.

7 (b) EACH SMALL RURAL DISTRICT THAT IS THE AUTHORIZER FOR A 8 CHARTER SCHOOL SHALL DISTRIBUTE TO THE CHARTER SCHOOL ONE 9 HUNDRED PERCENT OF AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE AMOUNT RECEIVED 10 PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (3)(a) OF THIS SECTION DIVIDED BY THE 11 FUNDED PUPIL COUNT OF THE SMALL RURAL DISTRICT FOR THE 2017-18 12 BUDGET YEAR, MULTIPLIED BY THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS ENROLLED IN 13 THE CHARTER SCHOOL FOR THE 2017-18 BUDGET YEAR. THE DISTRICT 14 CHARTER SCHOOL MAY USE THE MONEY IT RECEIVES PURSUANT TO THIS 15 SUBSECTION (3)(b) ONLY FOR NONRECURRING EXPENSES.

16 (4) THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL CALCULATE FOR EACH 17 ELIGIBLE INSTITUTE CHARTER SCHOOL AND DISTRIBUTE TO THE STATE 18 CHARTER SCHOOL INSTITUTE AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE PER PUPIL 19 DISTRIBUTION AMOUNT MULTIPLIED BY THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS 20 ENROLLED IN THE ELIGIBLE INSTITUTE CHARTER SCHOOL FOR THE 2017-18 21 BUDGET YEAR. THE STATE CHARTER SCHOOL INSTITUTE SHALL DISTRIBUTE 22 TO EACH ELIGIBLE INSTITUTE CHARTER SCHOOL ONE HUNDRED PERCENT 23 OF THE AMOUNT RECEIVED FOR THE ELIGIBLE INSTITUTE CHARTER SCHOOL 24 PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (4).

25 (5) This section is repealed, effective July 1, 2019.

26 **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 27 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the

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ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 1 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a 2 3 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 4 5 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 6 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 7 8 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
