A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE PROVISION OF STATE FUNDING FOR NATURAL 102 HAZARD MAPPING.

Bill Summary

Joint Budget Committee. The bill creates the natural hazard mapping fund, which consists of gifts, grants, and donations and the following revenues transferred from the general fund:

- ! On July 1, 2015, \$3.8 million;
- ! On July 1, 2016, \$2.4 million; and
- ! On July 1, 2017, \$670,000.

- 10 SHALL NOT ACCEPT A GIFT, GRANT, OR DONATION THAT IS SUBJECT TO A
- 11 CONDITION THAT IS INCONSISTENT WITH THIS SECTION OR ANY OTHER LAW
- 12 OF THE STATE;
- 13 (II) Interest derived from the investment of revenues in
- 14 THE MAPPING FUND; AND
- 15 (III) THE FOLLOWING REVENUES, WHICH THE STATE TREASURER
- 16 SHALL TRANSFER FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE MAPPING FUND:
- 17 (A) ON JULY 1, 2015, THREE MILLION EIGHT HUNDRED THOUSAND
- 18 DOLLARS;
- 19 (B) ON JULY 1, 2016, TWO MILLION FOUR HUNDRED THOUSAND
