## A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE EXEMPTION OF A STUDENT FROM THE REQUIREMENT 102 OF IMMUNIZATIONS FOR ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill clarifies that a certification or exemption letter required for exemption from a school immunization requirement may be from a licensed physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice nurse or a parent, guardian, emancipated student, or student 18 years of age or older. A person submitting a letter is not required to use a specified form.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-4-903, amend (2) 3 and (2.5)(b) as follows: 4 **25-4-903.** Exemptions from immunization - rules. (2) It is the 5 responsibility of the parent or legal guardian to have his or her child 6 immunized unless the child is exempted pursuant to this section. A 7 student shall be exempted from receiving the required immunizations in 8 the following manner: 9 (a) By submitting to the student's school certification from a 10 licensed physician, physician assistant authorized under section 11 12-36-106 (5), C.R.S., or advanced practice nurse that the physical 12 condition of the student is such that one or more specified immunizations 13 would endanger his or her life or health or is medically contraindicated 14 due to other medical conditions. Or THE CERTIFICATION MAY BE A LETTER 15 WRITTEN BY A LICENSED PHYSICIAN, PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT, OR ADVANCED 16 PRACTICE NURSE. A PARENT, GUARDIAN, PHYSICIAN, PHYSICIAN 17 ASSISTANT, OR ADVANCED PRACTICE NURSE IS NOT REQUIRED TO USE A 18 FORM FURNISHED BY THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH, THE DEPARTMENT OF 19 PUBLIC HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT, OR ANOTHER ENTITY. 20 (b) By submitting to the student's school a statement of exemption 21 signed by one parent or guardian or the emancipated student or student 22 eighteen years of age or older that the parent, guardian, or student is an 23 adherent to a religious belief whose teachings are opposed to 24 immunizations or that the parent or guardian or the emancipated student 25 or student eighteen years of age or older has a personal belief that is

12	9, 2017, if adjournment sine die is on May 10, 2017); except that, if a
13	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
14	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
15	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
16	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
17	November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
18	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
