A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE CREATION OF THE 2013 FLOOD RECOVERY ACCOUNT

102 IN THE DISASTER EMERGENCY FUND.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Joint Budget Committee. The bill creates the 2013 flood recovery account in the disaster emergency fund. On July 1, 2017, the state treasurer is required to transfer \$12.5 million from the general fund to the account. The account consists of money from this transfer and any money that the general assembly appropriates to the account in the future. Money in the account is only available for the governor to use for the costs







associated with the response and recovery from the flood that occurred in the state in 2013. The account is repealed on June 30, 2021, at which time the state treasurer will transfer any remaining balance back to the general fund.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-706, amend 2 3 (2)(a); and add (2.5) as follows: 4 24-33.5-706. Disaster emergency fund - established - financing 5 - legislative intent - repeal. (2) (a) A disaster emergency fund is hereby 6 established. which THE FUND consists of any moneys appropriated by the 7 general assembly, moneys transferred pursuant to paragraph (b) of 8 subsection (4) SUBSECTIONS (2.5) AND (4)(b) of this section, and moneys 9 to reimburse expenditures from the fund that are transmitted to the state 10 treasurer and credited to the fund. Moneys in the disaster emergency fund 11 shall remain in the fund until expended or until transferred pursuant to 12 subsection (4.3) or (4.5) SUBSECTION (2.5)(c), (4.3), OR (4.5) of this 13 section. 14 The 2013 Flood recovery account is hereby (2.5) (a) 15 CREATED IN THE DISASTER EMERGENCY FUND. THE ACCOUNT CONSISTS OF 16 MONEY TRANSFERRED IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (2.5)(b) OF THIS 17 SECTION AND ANY MONEY THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY SPECIFICALLY 18 APPROPRIATES TO THE ACCOUNT. THE MONEY THAT IS TRANSFERRED OR 19 APPROPRIATED TO THE ACCOUNT IS TO BE USED FOR THE COSTS 20 ASSOCIATED WITH THE RESPONSE AND RECOVERY FROM THE FLOOD THAT 21 OCCURRED IN THE STATE IN 2013. THE GOVERNOR SHALL NOT USE THE

22 MONEY IN THE ACCOUNT FOR ANY OTHER PURPOSE.

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(b) ON JULY 1, 2017, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER

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TWELVE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS FROM THE GENERAL
 FUND TO THE 2013 FLOOD RECOVERY ACCOUNT IN THE DISASTER
 EMERGENCY FUND.

4 (c) THIS SUBSECTION (2.5) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JUNE 30, 2021.
5 THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER ANY UNEXPENDED MONEY
6 REMAINING IN THE 2013 FLOOD RECOVERY ACCOUNT AS OF THAT DATE TO
7 THE GENERAL FUND.

8 SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
9 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
10 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
