Bill Summary

The bill creates the economic recovery and relief cash fund (fund) which consists of money deposited in the fund from the "American Rescue Plan Act of 2021" cash fund. To respond to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19 or its negative economic impacts, the bill allows the general assembly to appropriate or transfer money for specified uses.

The bill transfers \$40 million to the Colorado economic development fund for the Colorado office of economic development to use \$10 million of the appropriated money to incentivize small businesses to locate in rural Colorado and for the location neutral employment incentive program which provides incremental cash incentives per remote employee per year for up to 5 years to small businesses that hire new employees in designated rural areas of the state. The bill specifies that the remaining appropriated money must be used, subject to the fund requirements, to provide grants to small businesses or to undertake any other economic development activity in response to the negative economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The bill requires the executive committee of the legislative council to create a task force to meet during the 2021 legislative interim and issue a report with recommendations to the general assembly and the governor on policies that use money from the fund to provide a stimulative effect to the state's economy, necessary relief for Coloradans, or that address emerging economic disparities resulting from the pandemic.

26 (b) IN ADDITION TO THE USES SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (2)(a) OF
27 THIS SECTION:

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(I) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY APPROPRIATE MONEY TO A
 DEPARTMENT FROM THE FUND OR TRANSFER THE MONEY TO ANOTHER
 CASH FUND TO MAKE NECESSARY INVESTMENTS IN WATER, SEWER, OR
 BROADBAND INFRASTRUCTURE.

5 (II) (A) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY HEREBY FINDS AND DECLARES 6 THAT MANY BUSINESSES IN THE STATE, LARGE AND SMALL, AND 7 ESPECIALLY BUSINESSES IN RURAL AREAS, SUSTAINED SIGNIFICANT 8 NEGATIVE ECONOMIC IMPACTS AS A RESULT OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC 9 AND IT IS THEREFORE IMPORTANT AND APPROPRIATE THAT ANY ECONOMIC 10 DEVELOPMENT EFFORTS UNDERTAKEN WITH MONEY FROM THE FUND TO 11 SUPPORT THE STATE'S BUSINESSES MEET THE PURPOSE OF RESPONDING TO 12 THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC OR ITS NEGATIVE ECONOMIC CONSEQUENCES 13 AS SPECIFIED UNDER THE "AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021".

3 THREE DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS (3) (a) 4 SUBSECTION (3)(a), THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER EIGHT 5 HUNDRED FORTY-EIGHT MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE THOUSAND 6 SEVEN HUNDRED NINETY DOLLARS FROM THE "AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN 7 ACT OF 2021" CASH FUND CREATED IN SECTION 24-75-226 TO THE FUND. 8 (b) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL CREDIT ALL INTEREST AND 9 INCOME DERIVED FROM THE DEPOSIT AND INVESTMENT OF MONEY IN THE 10 FUND TO THE FUND.

17 (5) (a) THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL 18 SHALL, BY RESOLUTION, CREATE A TASK FORCE TO MEET DURING THE 2021 19 LEGISLATIVE INTERIM AND ISSUE A REPORT WITH RECOMMENDATIONS TO 20 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND THE GOVERNOR ON POLICIES THAT USE 21 MONEY FROM THE FUND TO PROVIDE A STIMULATIVE EFFECT TO THE 22 STATE'S ECONOMY, NECESSARY RELIEF FOR COLORADANS, OR THAT 23 ADDRESS EMERGING ECONOMIC DISPARITIES RESULTING FROM THE 24 PANDEMIC.

 ARE DUPLICATIVE OF ANY EXISTING STATE PROGRAMS OR
 APPROPRIATIONS, OR DUPLICATIVE OF ANY EXISTING FEDERALLY FUNDED
 STATE PROGRAM.

6 (c) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY APPROPRIATE MONEY FROM THE
7 FUND FOR THE REASONABLE EXPENSES OF THE TASK FORCE.

8 (d) THE TASK FORCE MAY INCLUDE NONLEGISLATIVE MEMBERS 9 AND CREATE WORKING GROUPS TO ASSIST THEM. THE EXECUTIVE 10 COMMITTEE OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL SHALL SPECIFY REQUIREMENTS 11 FOR MEMBERS' PARTICIPATION IN THE TASK FORCE. THE TASK FORCE 12 SHALL NOT SUBMIT BILL DRAFTS AS PART OF THEIR RECOMMENDATIONS.

(6) This section is repealed, effective July 1, 2027.

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14 **SECTION 2.** Appropriation. For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, 15 \$40,000,000 is appropriated to the office of the governor for use by 16 economic development programs. This appropriation is from the 17 Colorado economic development fund created in section 24-46-105, 18 C.R.S., and of money the state received from the federal coronavirus state 19 fiscal recovery fund. To implement this act, the office may use this 20 appropriation for assistance to businesses affected by the COVID-19 21 pandemic or its negative economic impacts.

SECTION 3. Appropriation. (1) For the 2021-22 state fiscal
 year, \$13,488 is appropriated to the legislative department for use by the
 legislative council. This appropriation is from the economic recovery and
 relief cash fund created in section 24-75-228 (2)(a), C.R.S., and of money
 the state received from the federal coronavirus state fiscal recovery fund
 and is based on an assumption that the legislative council will require an

1 additional 0.2 FTE. To implement this act, the legislative council may use

2 <u>this appropriation to implement this act.</u>

3 (2) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$8,470 is appropriated to the 4 legislative department for use by the general assembly. This appropriation 5 is from the economic recovery and relief cash fund created in section 6 24-75-228 (2)(a), and of money the state received from the federal 7 coronavirus state fiscal recovery fund. To implement this act, the general 8 assembly may use this appropriation for legislator reimbursement. 9 SECTION 4. Effective date. This act takes effect only if Senate 10 Bill 21-288 becomes law, and, in which case, this act takes effect either 11 upon the effective date of this act or one day after the effective date of 12 Senate Bill <u>21-288</u>, whichever is later. 13 SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,

determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.

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
